MORNING WORSHIP

The Responsible Christian - Galatians 6:6-10

Paul is showing to believers the importance of responsibility. Growing in Christ includes a Spirit-filled life.

- The first section addresses a Christian's life for personal examination. We don't compare ourselves to others and carry one another's loads.
- Believers must not fall into Christian professionalism. This is when we act with a pained smile and pious words.

Paul's greatest concern is for the advancement of the Gospel. Paul knew that the needs of the teachers had to be cared for.

We need faithful Bible-saturated churches and we need Christians to care for those in need.

Paul shifts to the standard of personal holiness for Christians - using the principle of sowing and reaping. This is a divine law. **Galatians 5:16**

John MacArthur said, "The Christian has only two fields in which he can sow, that of his own flesh and that of the Spirit."

Some believers sow in the flesh every day and wonder why they do not reap holiness, victory, and blessing.

John Stott says, "Holiness is harvest; whether we reap it or not depends almost entirely how we sow."

From our personal holiness we serve other believers. How?

1. Restoring a broken brother.
2. Bearing the burden of a hurt friend.
3. Look for ways to bless those in the household of faith.
