The Danger of Abandoning the Law of the Lord – 2 Chronicles 12:1-12

Rehoboam is the King of Judah, the son of Solomon.

Rehoboam was more wicked that his father. **1 Kings 14:23-24**, "They also built for themselves high places, sacred pillars, and Asherah poles on every high hill and under every green tree; there were even male cult prostitutes in the land."

King Shishak, the new Pharaoh in Egypt, invaded Judah as punishment for Rehoboam's sins.

Why did King Rehoboam abandon the law of the Lord?

2 Chronicles 12:1 says, "When Rehoboam had established his sovereignty and royal power."

What brought Rehoboam's downfall:

- → He became settled. He was strong.
- $\,\rightarrow\,$ Pride and self-reliance replaced dependence upon God.
- → He felt secure because he had fortified the cities in Judah they were very strong. **2 Chronicles 11:5-12**

Despite his security, Rehoboam collapsed to King Shishak. God uses Egypt to exalt, escape or humble His people. **Exodus 1:8-14**; **Matthew 2:13-15**

God sent the prophet Shemaiah to Rehoboam to rebuke him for abandoning the Lord.

Rehoboam's response:

- He and the princes repented and submitted to the Lord's righteousness.
- o God did not completely devastate Judah for Rehoboam's sins.
- God uses Pharaoh and prophets to bring about His purpose.
