

MORNING WORSHIP

Upsidedown – Jesus & the Adulteress

John 8:2-11

Note the footnote in your Bible regarding this event. Our earliest Bible manuscripts do not have John 7:53-8:11; Mark 16:9-20

Why is this?

- 1). This account is absent from the oldest copies of John. Unknown until the fourth century.
- 2). Where is does occur in later manuscripts, it is found in various places in John, including after Luke 21:38.
- 3). This section includes words that are not used elsewhere in John.
- 4). It appears to break the narrative flow from John 7:52 to John 8:12.

One of the hesitations of this passage is the liberal attitude of Jesus towards sexual sin.

Conclusion – this event might not have been included in John's original manuscript, yet there is nothing in this passage that would prevent us from believing it to be a truthful story concerning Jesus.

The scribes and the Pharisees knew of Jesus' compassion, they believed He would excuse her sin, which would violate the law.

The law being challenged is **Deuteronomy 22:22**, the death penalty is required of both the man and the woman who commit adultery.

Jesus doesn't ignore or excuse her sin, He acknowledges it – but He came to save sinners.

How this is Upsidedown:

- Jesus is the only one who could have thrown the first stone.
- Jesus does not condemn her.
- Jesus made every man ready to stone her, admit his sin. He's saying, "You're just like her."
