The Fruit of the Spirit – The External Final Five Galatians 5:22-23

Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness & Self-Control

Why should we "walk by the Spirit?" **v. 1** Being sensitive to the Spirit's leadership keeps us from giving into the flesh.

The contrast between "flesh" and "Spirit" describe the difference between slavery to selfishness and following the daily direction of the Holy Spirit. Paul is laying out the two ways we will live our lives.

It is through God's kindness that leads us to repentance. Romans 2:4

• Our lives should be marked as being kind towards others, not vengeful or unforgiving.

The Greek word *pistis* often refers to "trust" or "faith," and it can also mean "faithfulness." **Romans 3:3**

Faithfulness is the person who keeps his word and fulfills his promises.

It requires the work of the Spirit to produce faithfulness in your church life, family life, and work life. There is steadiness and consistency with a faithful believer.

Bring faithful is an inward, outward, and an upward action.

When we believe what God has said, faithfulness is continuing in that belief. He aren't changing or questioning God.

- Having faith does not mean simply believing in or agreeing with statements about God (James 2:19). Faith is active, and it requires dependence on God, a sense of trust that one chooses to walk in God's ways.
- How we are outwardly towards God and others, reveals if we have the fruit of the Spirit.
