"Arrogant eyes" is a prideful attitude towards others. You look at others, as the Pharisees did towards the tax collector, and thank God you're not like them. **Luke 18:9-14** 

The NKJV describes this as "a proud look." Pride is dangerous because it builds a wall between us and God. How do "arrogant eyes" manifest today:

- Refusing to Forgive
- "I told you so. You deserve it."
- Sarcasm

### Morning Worship

Prayer – Our Desire for God

Psalm 145:14-21

How you ever wondered: "What's my purpose?"

"What does God want me to do?"

**Psalm 145** tells us why we've been placed on earth. We're here to be in awe of the glory of God. Because of God's greatness, we live for His glory. The greatness of God should propel us to prayer and sharing His greatness to the next generation.

God is omniscient (all knowing), omnipresent (everywhere), and omnipotent (all powerful). When we approach Him, we must remember His attributes.

Psalm 145:14 reminds us that God guards our faith.

Think of all the different ways we can find ourselves falling – feeling like you can't go anymore:

- Falling into Temptation
- Falling in the Middle of a Trial
- Being Weighed Down
- Drowning in your Circumstances

The Lord upholds you when you are falling. He is your upholder.

Verse 14 also encourages us to face adversity with hope.

- God upholds us with His peace.
- God upholds us with His strength.
- God upholds us with His hope.
- God upholds us with His promises.
- God upholds us with His presence.

The picture of Psalm 145 should invite us to draw near to God:

- The Lord provides food for all creatures (vv. 15-16)
- The Lord answers prayer (vv. 18-19)
- The Lord protects His people (v. 20)
