

The Sinner's Prayer – Romans 10:1-13

The Sinner's Prayer is our response to God. We're praying for God to save us. It's not "magical words" rather a step of dependence upon the Lord. It is only faith in Jesus' death and resurrection that can save us.

"Repentance and faith are inseparable experiences of grace. Repentance is a genuine turning from sin toward God. Faith is the acceptance of Jesus Christ and commitment of the entire personality to Him a Lord and Saviour."

Billy Graham's sinner's prayer he led others in:

"Dear God, I know I am a sinner. I want to turn from my sins, and I ask for Your forgiveness. I believe that Jesus Christ is Your Son. I believe He died for my sins and that You raised Him to life. I want Him to come into my heart and to take control of my life. I want to trust Jesus as my Savior and follow Him as my Lord from this day forward. In Jesus' Name, amen."

Steps to Peace with God, Billy Graham

Three parts of the sinners prayer:

- First is understanding that we are all sinners.
- Second is knowing what God has done to remedy our lost and sinful condition. Christ's work on the cross.
- Third is our response.

Saying the sinner's prayer is simply a way of declaring to God that you're calling and relying on Jesus Christ as your Savior.
