Morning Worship

The Bible's Greatest Chapter - Romans 8:12-17

The first eleven verses of Romans 8 taught us about our privileges.

We have no obligation to live in the flesh. We set apart to live in the Spirit – we never forget our identity. We don't want to go "back to Egypt." Acts 7:39

Paul now shifts in this section to teach us about our present responsibilities.

The Puritan John Owen said, "You must always be killing sin or it will be killing you."

How do we "put to death" sin in our lives?

- 1. We confess the sin.
- 2. The surrender to Christ that we can't do it. Only He can help.
- 3. Apply Scripture to the sin. The Bible is the "sword of the Spirit" **Ephesians 6:17**
- 4. We walk in the Spirit. We do this by avoiding the person, app, texting them we set "guardrails" in place to prevent the sin coming back to life.

The spirit of adoption reminds us that we have a new position in Christ. We're no longer slaves, rather God is our Father.

Galatians 4:6 says, "And because you are sons, God sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, 'Abba, Father!'

- Fear has been replaced with acceptance. We don't believe the doctrine of adoption in our head, we allow it to shape our worldview.
- Our adoption is real and true but not yet complete. There will be suffering for being a child of God, but our final glorification is coming.
