

## Morning Worship

#### God Among His People – Isaiah 7:14; Matthew 1:18-25

How you wondered how unusual the birth of Jesus was?

- → Born to a virgin, who was engaged to Joseph.
- → Born in Bethlehem, while on a trip to register for a census a degree by Caesar Augustus in Rome.
- → Born in a house-barn because there was no room in the inn.
- → Laid in a manger, wrapped in a cloth as a sign for the shepherds.

The story of Christ's birth is prettied up for a Christmas story, but in reality, it was harsh.

- No one in Bethlehem would offer a pregnant woman almost in labor a bed.
- The Christmas story is that there is hope for a ruined humanity it's a message that 33 years later will pardon humanity.

Those awaiting the Messiah would look for Him in a standard, or kingly birth manner. And no one believed "Immanuel" literally meant God would become flesh and dwell among us. **John 1:14** 

John Piper said, "Christ Jesus came into the world to save us from fatalism. He came to stop people from saying, 'That's just the way I am.'"

What does "Immanuel" - "God is with us" look like in 2025:

God is with us – means to save us from critical spirits, from irritability, from harshness, from ingratitude, from laziness, from lust, from greed, from dullness toward prayer, from gambling, from alcoholism, from self-pity, from lovelessness.

"God is with us" should change how you know God, He's not "out there somewhere." He's near. **Matthew 28:20**
