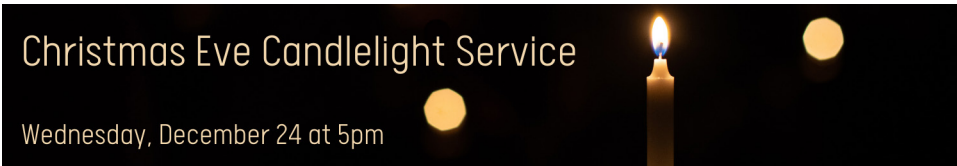

MORNING WORSHIP

The Shepherds in Bethlehem – Luke 2:8-20

The purpose of the shepherds were to be eyewitnesses to the birth of Christ the night He was born. Luke wrote His Gospel with “eyewitnesses” in mind. **Luke 1:1-4**

Shepherds were important to Luke for a simpler reason: They were the primary eyewitnesses of the events in Bethlehem that night, and they passed down the story through established methods of oral transmission.

→ Shepherds had bad reputations, especially those on the night shift. These men would have been rejected by other job – it wasn't an ideal job.

During the time of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob - shepherding was a noble occupation. When the twelve tribes of Israel migrated to Egypt, they encountered a lifestyle foreign to them. The Egyptians were agriculturalists. As farmers, they despised shepherding because sheep and goats meant death to crops. In the course of 400 years, the Egyptians prejudiced the Israelites' attitude towards shepherds. **Genesis 46:34**

The shepherds passed on orally what they can see and heard. **v. 20**

They were the first evangelists and confirmed what the angels told them.

Why the Shepherds?

- 1). They were the first eyewitnesses of Christ.
- 2). They foreshadowed Jesus' role as the Good Shepherd. **John 10:11**
- 3). God allowed the unlearned and rejected to see His Son first.

- The hope we find in the shepherds' story is this: God meets us right where we are, in our **ordinary moments**, with **His extraordinary love**. Just as He chose shepherds tending their flocks, He chooses us in whatever field we find ourselves.
