**Jesus of Bethlehem, then Nazareth – Matthew 2:1-20**

### Herod the Great –


Tried to kill Jesus in Bethlehem. He ruled in Israel until his death in 4 BC.  
This is why Jesus was likely born before 4 BC.

Herod was so ruthless to some of his own family, legend has it that Caesar Augustus reportedly said, "It is better to be Herod's dog than one of his children."

### Herod Archelaus –

Son of Herod the Great. Ruled in Judea (Bethlehem) during Jesus' return from Egypt.

Jesus took the title, "Jesus of Nazareth" to hide His identity of being born in Bethlehem. Jesus was one of the infants that should have been killed from Herod the Great's massacre.
