

Consider bringing your favorite homemade Ice Cream to share and impress your friends.



THANK GOD I'M A PRESBYTERIAN!

Many of OHPC's members may recall that I spent 32 years working for the federal courts, with most of my career at the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fifth Circuit in New Orleans. Although I was also active as a church musician throughout my time, I kept my court life separate from my church life. With the need for the separation of church and state, especially in the Judicial Branch, my approach was always careful and prudent.



Not everyone with whom I worked observed the curtain between church and state. Sometimes folks wore religious jewelry. Others joined prayer groups at their lunch hours. And some employees evangelized in the workplace. As a government official, I didn't worry about jewelry and prayer groups away from the office, but I discouraged evangelical behavior at work, attempting to keep the office entirely non-sectarian.



One of my colorful colleagues in another circuit got into trouble for not observing this separation. A florid and delightfully candid manager of a court legal office, he would proudly exclaim, "I sure am glad I'm a Presbyterian and am saved by faith and grace . . . I'd never make it on my works!" An attentive listener might get past the bluster and realize this outsized character was confessing humility and human frailty. His office of 30 staff included 6 or 7 Presbyterians, all delighted at his comments. But at least one person was sufficiently offended to file a hostile workplace complaint with the Chief Judge. My friend was deemed religiously oppressive.

The Chief Judge gently urged restraint by the legal manager, noting that some employees are more prone to complain and be unhappy, but that management had to take the high road. My friend reluctantly followed the Chief's admonition, later muttering, "I'm still glad I'm a Presbyterian!"

Fortunately for all of us, when we gather for worship at OHPC, we can truly be enthusiastic and celebrate, "I sure am glad I'm a Presbyterian – An Oak Hills Presbyterian - and am saved by faith and grace!" May we always be blessed in our worship and ministries.

makes. Upholstery must be in good clean condition to sell but wood furniture can be refinished or painted over which makes furniture the top seller. Outdoor items also sell quickly.




In sheer quantity we need:

holiday decorations, luggage, jewelry, purses, shoes, belts, books, records, DVDs, CDs, tapes, video games, as well as working computer equipment, flat screen televisions, and stereo equipment, toys, bicycles, sporting equipment, linens such as sheets, towels, bedspreads/quilts, pillows, sewing items, craft supplies, women's, men's, children's clothing.

DO NOT bring us: Any size old tube TVs or any TVs in a wood cabinet. They do not sell and Salvation Army won't accept them. That includes old tube computer monitors as well and soiled/torn mattresses or upholstery.

Results: A win-win for everyone!


- ⇒ You win by decluttering.

Air Conditioning and Heating

As most of you know we have had a challenging spring and summer with our air conditioning systems. This spring a storm passed through and a lightening strike damaged two systems, as the summer heat rose, we lost 4 more units (including the sanctuary) and another was identified as being in critical condition. All these systems had been in service for approximately 20 years, it was time. With your assistance (advice, prayers, and financial support) we are back on track. Of the most critical units three have been replaced, two have been repaired. Workarounds have been instituted to allow us to continue to function with minimum discomfort, and plans are in the works to fully recover them.


