

### Introduction to Worship

St. Andrew's Church welcomes all gathered to worship today. The services of worship are taken from the Holy Bible, the Book of Common Prayer (1928), and the Hymnal (1940). Copies of all three can be found in the pew racks of the church. Below in the bulletin, numbers in the Hymnal are listed on the left and Prayer Book page numbers on the right. It is our custom to stand to sing, kneel to pray, and sit to listen. If you need assistance, ushers will be glad to answer any questions or to assist you. Sanitized hearing assistance devices are available near the entrance doors; if you use one, be sure to set the device at channel E. Print in bold is to be said by all.

Please practice social distancing. Family units should social distance from other family units. Please sit apart from other families. That also means we will not process as normal. At the end of the service, we will dismiss by rows beginning at the back of the church nearest the doors and then move forward this will avoid bunching up in the aisles and at the door.

O PRAISE LET God arise, and let his enemies be scattered;

#### THE FIRST LESSON I Peter 4:12-19 (sit)

<sup>12</sup> Beloved, do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal which comes upon you to prove you, as though something strange were happening to you. <sup>13</sup> But rejoice in so far as you share Christ's sufferings, that you may also rejoice and be glad when his glory is revealed. <sup>14</sup> If you are reproached for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the spirit of glory and of God rests upon you. <sup>15</sup> But let none of you suffer as a murderer, or a thief, or a wrongdoer, or a mischief-maker; <sup>16</sup> yet if one suffers as a Christian, let him not be ashamed, but under that name let him glorify God. <sup>17</sup> For the time has come for judgment to begin with the household of God; and if it begins with us, what will be the end of those who do not obey the gospel of God? <sup>18</sup> And "If the righteous man is scarcely saved, where will the impious and sinner appear?" <sup>19</sup> Therefore let those who suffer according to God's will do right and entrust their souls to a faithful Creator.

614/618 Te Deum laudamus (stand).....BCP p .10

WE praise thee, O God; we acknowledge thee to be the Lord.

All the earth doth worship thee, the Father everlasting. To thee all Angels cry aloud; the Heavens, and all the Powers therein;

To thee Cherubim and Seraphim continually do cry, Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of Sabaoth; Heaven and earth are full of the Majesty of thy glory. The glorious company of the Apostles praise thee. The goodly fellowship of the Prophets praise thee. The noble army of Martyrs praise thee. The holy Church throughout all the world doth acknowledge thee; The Father, of an infinite Majesty; Thine adorable, true, and only Son; Also the Holy Ghost, the Comforter.

THOU art the King of Glory, O Christ. Thou art the everlasting Son of the Father. When thou tookest upon thee to deliver man, thou didst humble thyself to be born of a Virgin. #### THE SECOND LESSON John 17:1-11 (sit)

When Jesus had spoken these words, he lifted up his eyes to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come; glorify thy Son that the Son may glorify thee, <sup>2</sup> since thou hast given him power over all flesh, to give eternal life to all whom thou hast given him. <sup>3</sup> And this is eternal life, that they know thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom thou hast sent. 4 I glorified thee on earth, having accomplished the work which thou gavest me to do; <sup>5</sup> and now, Father, glorify thou me in thy own presence with the glory which I had with thee before the world was made. 6 "I have manifested thy name to the men whom thou gavest me out of the world; thine they were, and thou gavest them to me, and they have kept thy word. 7 Now they know that everything that thou hast given me is from thee; 8 for I have given them the words which thou gavest me, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from thee; and they have believed that thou didst send me. 9 I am praying for them; I am not praying for the world but for those whom thou hast given me, for they are thine; 10 all mine are thine, and thine are mine, and I am glorified in them. 11 And now I am no more in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to thee. Holy Father, keep them in thy name, which thou hast given me, that they may be one, even as we are one.

## 643 Jubilate Deo((stand) ......BCP p. 15

O BE joyful in the LORD, all ye lands: serve the LORD with gladness, and come before his presence with a song. Be ye sure that the LORD he is God; it is he that hath made us, and not we ourselves; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture. O go your way into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise; be thankful unto him, and speak good of his Name. For the LORD is gracious, his mercy is everlasting; and his truth endureth from generation to generation.

I BELIEVE in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth: And in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord: Who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, Born of the Virgin Mary: Suffered under Pontius Pilate, Was crucified, dead, and buried: He descended into hell; The third day he rose again from the dead: He ascended into heaven, And sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty: From thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.
