- 2. Read Vs. 1-4.
- 3. Paul describes himself as a "servant of God." How does his service differ from yours? How is it the same?
- 4. Verse 1 speaks of "the knowledge of the truth that leads to godliness." Why does truth lead to this? What expectation does that place on us?
- 5. Verses 2-3 tell us that eternal life was promised before the beginning of time but not revealed until the "appointed season." Do you have any questions or comments about God's timing?
- 6. What was entrusted to the Apostle Paul? What has been entrusted to you?
- 7. Read Verses 5-9
- 8. Which of these Elder qualifications are particularly meaningful to you? What would you like to see more of in the Elders at HTC?
- 9. Why is "blameless" mentioned twice?
- 10. Why are Elders who meet these qualifications so important to the local church?
- 11. Read 10-16
- 12. What do we learn about the false teachers from this passage?
- 13. What do you tend to get legalistic about? What advice would you give someone who has legalistic tendencies?
- 14. Does Paul's quote about Cretans seem a little harsh? Why or why not?
- 15. How is Titus supposed to handle these false teachers? What's the goal or hoped for outcome?
- 16. What application does this have for us?
- 17. What does Vs. 15 mean when it says "to the pure, all things are pure." Compare with Mark 7:15. How might someone abuse this and use it to justify doing what they shouldn't? How can this be avoided?
- 18. What needs to change in your life so that you can more fully love what is good?
