Sermon Title: A Thousand Good Years

Sermon Date: March 25, 2018

Scripture: Revelation 20

Speaker: Pastor Rod Randall

Pastor Rod opened his sermon with quotes and lyrics that use the word, “thousand.” What were they? Which ones have you heard the most or used yourself?

READ Chapter 20

1. The chapter begins with a description of Satan’s fate during the millennium. What do we learn about him in verses 1-3? How can this prepare us for resisting him now?
2. When you think of Satan tempting or attacking, what Bible stories stand out the most?
3. Verse 4 speaks of those “who had been given authority to judge.” How do you react to the idea of being among them? See 1 Cor. 6:2 and 2 Tim. 2:12. What does this say about God’s view of us?
4. What part of the world would you like to reign over during the millennium?
5. How can we do a better job of ruling and reigning now?
6. What does the “first resurrection” of verse 6 refer to? See 1 Cor. 15:23, Matt. 27:52-53, 1 Thess. 4:13-18, Rev. 11:11, 20:4, Dan. 12:1-2.
7. When you think of having a resurrected body, what comes to mind? See Isaiah 65:18-25 and 1 Corinthians 15:50-54 for a look at what the millennium will look like.
8. Why do you think God allows Satan to have one last chance at freedom?
9. Verse 8 says that those who join Satan’s army “are like the sand on the seashore.” Does this surprise you?
10. What determines a person’s fate based on verses 12-15?
11. How does Jesus’ message in Matthew 25:31-46 compare?
12. How do passages that speak on eternal punishment impact your understanding of God, priorities, people?
13. Can you think of other passages that teach about final judgment?
14. What take-away’s do you have from this week’s lesson?
