PARTICIPATING IN GOD'S STORY

We love good stories. The best stories have a way of capturing our imaginations and making us believe, if only for a moment, that we belong in them. The Bible has an explanation for this. It tells us that God is writing the story of all stories, and we were created to inhabit His drama of redemption.

Since antiquity, the church has rehearsed and participated in God's story by keeping time differently than the rest of the culture. Of course, the church still counts days and hours, but the seasons of its calendar are inspired by the annual feasts and celebrations of God's people in Scripture. The church calendar (also known as the Christian or liturgical calendar) is an aid that helps Christians orient their lives around the biblical story. The seasons of Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost tell the story of the good news of Jesus and the work of the Spirit in the life of the Church.

ADVENT: Waiting, preparation, and anticipation for the coming of Christ.

CHRISTMAS: The mystery of God becoming man in the person of Jesus.

EPIPHANY: The revelation of Jesus Christ to the world.

LENT: A 40-day period of penitence, self-examination, and preparation.

EASTER: A 50-day celebration of the Resurrection.

PENTECOST: The arrival of the Holy Spirit and birth of the church.

Our default setting is to let cultural holidays, sports seasons, and entertainment dictate our rhythms. Inevitably, this pattern leaves us feeling tired and restless in a confusing story. The beauty of the church calendar is that it transforms something as basic as time into a means of discipleship and Christian formation

As we dramatize the gospel with common colors, postures, songs, prayers, and disciplines, we are united in time with Christians all over the world— watching, anticipating, celebrating, longing, lamenting, and living together in one common story. Advent is the beginning of the new church year and a chance for us to set up rhythms of prayer and worship that fortify us in a culture of competing stories.

THE SEASON OF **ADVENT**

Advent means "coming," and its posture is that of longing, expectation, and waiting. During this time, the church looks back to Jesus' first coming and looks forward to his coming again. This world is broken. We feel the impact of sin and death in almost every aspect of life. In light of this, the cry of Advent is a cry for help from those who have experienced the tyranny of injustice in a world under the curse of sin. It is also the cry of hope from those who await God's deliverance. Advent calls us to wait and prepare for Jesus' coming by repenting and believing.

The dominant color of advent is purple, which stands for royalty, symbolizing the coming of the king. The Scripture readings that accompany Advent are drawn from Old Testament messianic prophesies and New Testament messianic fulfillment passages. Common disciplines within the church during this season include confessing sin, acknowledging and lamenting the brokenness in the world, longing for a redeemer, and rehearsing the promises of God.

How to Use This **Devotional**

This devotional is designed to be practiced with others (spouses, children, roommates), but it can serve as a personal devotional as well. Each day guides you through a reflection, call to prayer, song, advent reading, discussion, prayer, and benediction.

CROSSROADS KIDS TRACK

To assist children, Nathan Sharpton has added a section to connect the minds and bodies of kids to the reading for that day. For a more accessible bible translation, consider reading from the New Living Translation.

MUSIC

When you come to a song you can sing a verse printed in the back of this book, listen to a recording, or simply read the lyrics since carols are poetry with rich theology. As I began sketching ideas, I found myself starting to incorporate the familiar feeding trough in the manger scene. As I sat with this scene, my desire grew for baby Jesus to be held by Mary. There is a powerful and true juxtaposition of Jesus needing to be held in His delicacy, and yet His glory necessitates their posture of kneeling. I have a love for animals and felt it natural to frame Jesus, Mary, and Joseph with the animals in the manger. "All Creatures of Our God and King" is my favorite hymn, and my hand couldn't help but start sketching a little kitten in awe of the Messiah.

As for the other images, I pulled the same colors while zooming out to capture the vastness of God's grace with the guiding star. The gold color represents the holiness of Christ while the bright coral red hints at Christ's human suffering. The palm leaves throughout foreshadow Christ's path. In one of the images, we see the other side of the hill where the wise men are traveling toward Christ. Upon meditation, I was led to portray the intense anticipation of what they knew was awaiting them. In all of their obedience and wonder, they took one step at a time to offer Christ the Messiah what they had.

Each image feels applicable to me today — no matter how close He feels, there is a guiding light to be followed in the dark. And this light will take us all the way to the most humble and most glorious place.



FIRST WEEK OF ADVENT

MONDAY, DECEMBER 1

REFLECTION

Advent is designed to show that the meaning of Christmas is diminished to the vanishing point if we are not willing to take a fearless inventory of the darkness.

CROSSROADS KIDS

What does it feel like to wait for a promise? Before beginning the devotional, make a promise to the child. This promise can be something small, like a treat or an activity, that the children will look forward to after reading together. Now ask, "what are two feelings you have when you're waiting for a promise to come true?"

ADVENT READING

Genesis 3:1–15

The Fall of Man and the first promise of the Messiah is revealed.

Now the serpent was more crafty than any other beast of the field that the LORD God had made. He said to the woman, "Did God actually say, 'You shall not eat of any tree in the garden'?" 2 And the woman said to the serpent, "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden, 3 but God said, 'You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the midst of the garden, neither shall you touch it, lest you die." 4 But the serpent said to the woman, "You will not surely die. 5 For God knows that when

The Fall of Man and the first promise of the Messiah is revealed. you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil." 6 So when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was a delight to the eyes, and that the tree was to be desired to make one wise, she took of its fruit and ate, and she also gave some to her husband who was with her, and he ate. 7 Then the eyes of both were opened, and they knew that they were naked. And they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves loincloths. 8 And they heard the sound of the LORD God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of the LORD God among the trees of the garden. 9 But the LORD God called to the man and said to him, "Where are you?" 10 And he said, "I heard the sound of you in the garden, and I was afraid, because I was naked, and I hid myself." 11 He said, "Who told you that you were naked? DISCUSS

How does the text reveal the impact of sin on our relationship with creation, other people, and our creator?

PRAYER

- Pray for our students—that they would have open hearts and open minds to receive and respond to God's Word.
- Pray for family, friends, neighbors, and co-workers who are suffering.

BENEDICTION

Wait for the LORD; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the LORD!

FIRST WEEK OF ADVENT

TUESDAY, DECEMBER 2

REFLECTION

For all the promises of God find their Yes in him.

That is why it is through him that we utter our Amen to God for his glory.

CROSSROADS KIDS

In the passage for today, the Lord makes a big promise and uses the number of stars in the skye as the example of how big the promise is. Step outside and count the stars. See who can count the highest! If it is cloudy, look up how many stars are in the milkyway galaxy alone.

And the angel of the LORD called to Abraham a second time from heaven 16 and said, "By myself I have sworn, declares the LORD, because you have done this and have not withheld your son, your only son, 17 I will surely bless you, and I will surely multiply your offspring as the stars of heaven and as the sand that is on the seashore. And your offspring shall possess the gate of his enemies, 18 and in your offspring shall all the nations of the earth be blessed, because you have obeyed my voice."

DISCUSS

God said, "By myself I have sworn..." Why do you think God chose to confirm His promise with an oath? What does this action tell us about the certainty and reliability of His word?

God promised that in Abraham's "offspring shall all the nations of the earth be blessed." Who is the ultimate "offspring" that fulfills this promise and how do you become a descendent of Him? See Galatians 3:27-29

PRAYER

- Pray for marriages to be places of mutual love, joy, and honor.
- Pray for those who are sick or suffer from cronic pain.
- Tim & Rachel Price (RUF, WashU) Pray for the freshmen at WashU
 to have open hearts towards God and one another, and for student
 leaders to continue serving with a Christlike heart. Pray that as Tim
 studies and teaches Scripture, he will love the Lord more deeply and
 glorify him.

BENEDICTION

CROSSROADS KIDS

Ask your children to think about a story with a bad king (It could be from a movie or a book). What makes a king bad? Now imagine a story with a good king! What makes a king good? What kind of King do we read about in Ps. 72? If this passage is about Jesus, what kind of king is he?

ADVENT READING

Psalm 72:1-4,12-19 *A Divine King Shall Reign*

Give the king your justice, O God, and your righteousness to the royal son! 2 May he judge your people with righteousness, and your poor with justice! 3 Let the mountains bear prosperity for the people, and the hills, in righteousness! 4 May he defend the cause of the poor of the people, give deliverance to the children of the needy, and crush the oppressor! 12 For he delivers the needy when he calls, the poor and him who has

no helper. 13 He has pity on the weak and the needy, and saves the lives of the needy. 14 From oppression and violence he redeems their life, and precious is their blood in his sight. 15 Long may he live; may gold of Sheba be given to him! May prayer be made for him continually, and blessings invoked for him all the day! 16 May there be abundance of grain in the land; on the tops of the mountains may it wave; may its fruit be like Lebanon; and may people blossom in the cities like the grass of the field! 17 May his name endure forever, his fame continue as long as the sun! May people be blessed in him, all nations call him blessed! 18 Blessed be the Lord, the God of Israel, who alone does wondrous things. 19 Blessed be his glorious name forever; may the whole earth be filled with his glory! Amen and Amen!

DISCUSS

Psalm 72 describes a king who rules with justice, cares for the poor, and brings peace. Which of these qualities stands out to you the most, and why do you think it matters for the people he leads?

How does this picture of a good king help you imagine the kind of world God wants to create through Jesus?

PRAYER

- That the Lord would raise up new leaders and hosts who will extend the hospitality of our community to the many new attendees calling Crossroads home.
- Vasyl & Viktoria Agarkov (MTW, Ukraine) Pray for the children of Ukraine who have lost their families. For the Agarkov family in particular, pray that their children will adjust well to changing rhythms, and that their many needs related to raising children would be met.

BENEDICTION

Wait for the LORD; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the LORD!

FIRST WEEK OF ADVENT

THURSDAY, DECEMBER 4

REFLECTION

The disappointment, brokenness, suffering, and pain that characterize life in this present world is held in dynamic tension with the promise of future glory that is yet to come. In that Advent tension, the church lives its life."

CALL TO PRAYER

Who is this King of glory?
The Lord, strong and mighty, the Lord, mighty in battle!
Lift up your heads, O gates!

SONG

Come, Thou Long Expected Jesus

CROSSROADS KIDS

Hide an object in the house and don't give any hints on how to find it. After they can't find it, make a sign that directs them where to go. Now listen of the hints in the passage about how to find Jesus when he arrives.

ADVENT READING

Isaiah 7:14

Christ's birth and kingdom are foretold by the prophet Isaiah.

7:14 Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel.

Christ's birth and kingdom are foretold by the prophet Isaiah.

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who dwelt in a land of deep darkness, on them has light shined. 3 You have multiplied the nation; you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as they are glad when they divide the spoil. 4 For the yoke of his burden, and the staff for his shoulder, the rod of his oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. 5 For every boot of the tramping warrior in battle tumult and every garment rolled in blood will be burned as fuel for the fire. 6 For to us a child is born, to us a son is given; and the government shall be upon his shoulder, and his name shall be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. 7 Of the increase of his government and of peace there will be no end, on the throne of David and over his kingdom, to establish it and to uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time forth and forevermore. DISCUSS

Which name in v.6 stands out to you and why? What do the names of the promised Messiah tell us about Him?

PRAYER

- Pray for women who long to be mothers—that they would rest in the arms of a loving and compassionate God.
- Pray for the volunteers and teachers at Crossroads—that they would be energized, prepared, and filled with the Spirit as they speak truth and love into the hearts of our Crossroads Kids.

REFLECTION

SONG

O Day of Peace

CROSSROADS KIDS

Ask your kids which animals go well together and which animals don't go well together. Do lambs like to play with wolves? What about leopards and goats? What about lions and cows? It would be very scary for some of these animals to play with wolves, leopards and lions. The Bible describes a peace that will come over the whole earth that will make everyone and everything feel safe.

ADVENT READING

Isaiah 11:1-9

A shoot shall come forth from the stump of Jesse.

There shall come forth a shoot from the stump of Jesse, and a branch from his roots shall bear fruit. 2 And the Spirit of the LORD shall rest upon him, the Spirit of wisdom and understanding, the Spirit of counsel and might, the Spirit of knowledge and the fear of the LORD. 3 And his delight shall be in the fear of the LORD. He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide disputes by what his ears hear, 4 but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; and he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked. 5 Righteousness shall

be the belt of his waist, and faithfulness the belt of his loins. 6 The wolf shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the young goat, and the calf and the lion and the fattened calf together; and a little child shall lead them. 7 The cow and the bear shall graze; their young shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox. 8 The nursing child shall play over the hole of the cobra, and the weaned child shall put his hand on the adder's den. 9 They shall not hurt or destroy in all my holy mountain; for the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the LORD as the waters cover the sea.

DISCUSS

Isaiah paints a picture of a world where even natural enemies live in peace. How does this vision of harmony and safety give you hope? This prophecy points to God's ultimate plan for creation. How does it encourage you to trust that God is at work, even in a world of division and strife?

PRAYER

- For unity in Christ to overpower division in the church.
- Pray for the art community (musicians, artists, writers)— that their work will be a source of truth, beauty, and light, directing others to the Creator.
- Travis Hutchinson (RUF, Brown University + RISD) Pray that the Lord would put the desire to be a part of a campus fellowship into the hearts of students. Pray that the Lord strengthens RUF campus ministers like Travis as they share life with students on campus.

BENEDICTION

Wait for the LORD; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the LORD!

FIRST WEEK OF ADVENT

SATURDAY, DECEMBER 6

REFLECTION

But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; God chose what is low and despised in the world, even things that are not, to bring to nothing things that are.

CALL TO PRAYER

And you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel.

SONG

O Come, All Ye Faithful

CROSSROADS KIDS

Find a small toy or object that fits in your child's hand that's important to them? Micah says Bethlehem is "too little to be among the clans of Judah." Why do you think God chose a small, unimportant town like Bethlehem for the birthplace of the heavenly king?

ADVENT READING

Micah 5:2-4

The glory of little Bethlehem is foretold by the prophet Micah.

But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah, who are too little to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose coming forth is from of old, from ancient days. 3 Therefore he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labor has given birth; then the rest of his brothers shall return to the people of Israel. 4 And he shall stand and shepherd his flock in the strength of the LORD, in the majesty of the name of the LORD his God. And they shall dwell secure, for now he shall be great to the ends of the earth.

DISCUSS

What are some examples of God using the seemingly small and insignificant things, places, or people for His purposes?

The prophecy ends by saying, "they shall dwell secure" and He "shall be great to the ends of the earth." What does it mean for you to feel secure because Jesus is your great King and Shepherd?


PRAYER

CALL TO PRAYER

CROSSROADS KIDS

Sometimes people feel sad around Christmas. Can you think of any reasons why that might be? If you ever feel sad, did you know God wants you to pray to him because He wants to be with you. What is one thing you feel sad about that you want to tell God?

ADVENT READING

Psalm 42

Why are you cast down O my soul? Hope in God, for I shall again praise Him.

As a deer pants for flowing streams, so pants my soul for you, O God. 2 My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When shall I come and appear before God? 3 My tears have been my food day and night, while they say to me all the day long, "Where is your God?" 4 These things

Why are you cast down O my soul? Hope in God, for I shall again praise Him.

I remember, as I pour out my soul: how I would go with the throng and lead them in procession to the house of God with glad shouts and songs of praise, a multitude keeping festival. 5 Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation 6 and my God. My soul is cast down within me; therefore I remember you from the land of Jordan and of Hermon, from Mount Mizar. 7 Deep calls to deep at the roar of your waterfalls; all your breakers and your waves have gone over me. 8 By day the LORD commands his steadfast love, and at night his song is with me, a prayer to the God of my life. 9 I say to God, my rock: "Why have you forgotten me? Why do I go mourning because of the oppression of the enemy?" 10 As with a deadly wound in my bones, my adversaries taunt me, while they say to me all the day long, "Where is your God?" 11 Why are you cast down, O my soul, and why are you in turmoil within me? Hope in God; for I shall again praise him, my salvation and my God.

DISCUSS

What are some of the reasons why the psalmist's soul is cast down? How can you relate? Have you taken your sadness to God? Why or why not?

PRAYER

- For those who feel especially sad or lonely around Christmas.
- The homeless population— pray for shelter, warmth, food, and for local churches and ministries to be Christ's hands and feet in meeting their essential needs.
- Pray for the comfort of parents who have lost children, either in the womb or in the world.

BENEDICTION

The LORD your God is in your midst...he will quiet you by his love; he will exult over you with loud singing.

SECOND WEEK OF ADVENT

TUESDAY, DECEMBER 9

REFLECTION

A prison cell, in which one waits, hopes - and is completely dependent on the fact that the door of freedom has to be opened from the outside, is not a bad picture of Advent.

CROSSROADS KIDS

Have you ever been lost and not known where your parents are? Did someone come and find you? The passage from Isaiah says, "All we like sheep have gone astray". In the same way we all need Jesus to come and find us when we are lost.

For he grew up before him like a young plant, and like a root out of dry ground; he had no form or majesty that we should look at him, and no beauty that we should desire him. 3 He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not. 4 Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted. 5 But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed. 6 All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—every one—to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

DISCUSS

Isaiah 53 was written 700 years before Jesus was born, yet it speaks of his suffering in specific detail. What did Jesus have to endure so that we could be saved?

PRAYER

- Pray for the brokenhearted parents whose children are not walking with the Lord, that they may know God is the perfect, loving Father.
- For our neighboring churches and their pastors Pastors Erik Johnson at Concordia Lutheran and Aaron Halstead at Midcities Church.
 That the church would thrive and Maplewood would be blessed.
- Clarke & Khrystya Norton (MTW, Ukraine) Pray for continued unity at the Lviv Holy Trinity Church as it grows and searches for a larger worship space. For the Nortons, pray that the Lord will grant patience and clarity as they discern their calling and desire to return to Lviv.

BENEDICTION

REFLECTION

CROSSROADS KIDS

Ask your children to close their eyes because you want to gie them a gift. Place a piece of chocolate or a small piece of candy in their hands. Then ask them to guess why you gave them a treat. It was a gift they didn't earn or deserve but you were delighted to give it. It was gift of grace. The gift that God gives us is by grace.

ADVENT READING

Romans 3:21-28

DISCUSS

DISCUSS

According to this text, how does God respond to those who repent? Share a time when you experienced the kindness of God in the face of your sin.

PRAYER

- Those struggling with addiction pray for strength to take one day at a time, for renewed resolve, and for the grace of total surrender to Christ the Savior.
- For the men and women who are in prison and their families. Pray for their salvation, rehabilitation, and for the love of Christ to penetrate the d arkness and isolation of their cells.
- Kirk & Anna Norris (RUF-I, WashU) Pray that God would break through years of materialistic and atheistic thinking among unbelieving students, especially those from East Asia, making the Gospel plausible and attractive. There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. 2 For the law of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death. 3 For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do. By sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and for sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, 4 in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the Spirit.

Discuss

What joy and relief does this passage bring you? Where do you see yourself still trying to fulfill the law to earn God's favor?

PRAYER

- Those who have walked away from the Christian faith.
- Pray for our middle and high schoolers—that they would grow in their identity in Christ.

CROSSROADS KIDS

What are your family's Christmas traditions? What's better, your traditions before Christmas or Christmas? ADVENT READING

Hebrews 10:1–10

Christ came to fulfill the need for an all-sufficient sacrifice for sins.

For since the law has but a shadow of the good things to come instead of the true form of these realities, it can never, by the same sacrifices that are continually offered every year, make perfect those who draw near. 2 Otherwise, would they not have ceased to be offered, since the worshipers, having once been cleansed, would no longer have any consciousness of sins? 3 But in these sacrifices there is a reminder of sins

every year. 4 For it is impossible for the blood of bulls and goats to take away sins. 5 Consequently, when Christ came into the world, he said, "Sacrifices and offerings you have not desired, but a body have you prepared for me; 6 in burnt offerings and sin offerings you have taken pleasure in sacrifices and offerings and burnt offerings and sin offerings" (these are offered according to the law), 9 then he added, "Behold, I have come to do your will." He does away with the first in order to establish the second. 10 And by that will we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.

DISCUSS

The text says Jesus "does away with the first in order to establish the second." What is the "first" (the old way) that was done away with, and what is the "second" (the new way) that was established?

PRAYER

- Pray for those caught in the frantic pace of the season; that they may find a moment of stillness to recognize the sacred waiting of Advent.
- Mental health workers— pray for strength, compassion, wisdom, and stamina for those who dedicate their careers to helping others navigate mental illness.
- For children in the foster care system and those who care for them.

BENEDICTION

The Lord is our light and our protector. He gives us grace and glory. No good thing will the Lord withhold from those who do what is right. Blessed are those who trust in him.

BENEDICTION

PRAYER

Pray for a spirit of self-examination and confession, asking the Light
of the World to reveal hidden areas of sin that need to be cleared out
to prepare the heart.

BENEDICTION

The Lord is our light and our protector. He gives us grace and glory. No good thing will the Lord withhold from those who do what is right. Blessed are those who trust in him.


PRAYER

ADVENT READING

Luke 1:39–56 *Mary's Song*

In those days Mary arose and went with haste into the hill country, to a town in Judah, 40 and she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. 41 And when Elizabeth heard the greeting of Mary, the baby leaped in her womb. And Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit, 42 and she exclaimed with a loud cry, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb! 43 And why is this granted to me that the mother of my Lord should come to me? 44 For behold, when the sound of your greeting came to my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. 45 And blessed is she who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her from the Lord."

DISCUSS

Mary's song is a beautiful prayer where she praises God for what He has done. She says, "My soul magnifies the Lord." Why does Mary magnify the Lord? What does it mean to magnify something? How does praising God help you see Him as bigger and more wonderful?

PRAYER

- The Elderly or those in care facilities— pray for companionship, dignity, freedom from loneliness, and for comfort in these latter years.
- For opportunities to welcome strangers and show the love of Christ this Christmas.
- Pray for church unity across denominations and for a truthful witness until He returns.

BENEDICTION

And we know that the Son of God has come and has given us understanding, so that we may know him who is true; and we are in him who is true, in his Son Jesus Christ. He is the true God and eternal life.

In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. 2 This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. 3 And all went to be registered, each to his own town. 4 And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, 5 to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. 6 And while they were there, the time came for her to give birth. 7 And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

DISCUSS

The incarnation of Jesus shows us that there is nowhere that God cannot show up. He condescends to be "with" us in Jesus and now by his Holy Spirit. In what places of weakness or simplicity in your life do you long to experience God's presence?

PRAYER

- Educators/school administrators— pray for patience, wisdom in handling complex challenges, and energy to pour into the next generation.
- Stephen & Audrey Moss (Harvest USA) Pray for focus and wisdom as Stephen writes The Story of Sex for high school students. Ask that he would be diligent, resist perfectionism, and rely on the Lord. Pray also for Audrey and their daughters—that God would be near them while Stephen travels and help him be fully present at home.






