A Pastor's Perception

But this problem may plague us more than just on Easter. How many of us are less than excited to wake up each day? Perhaps what was once exciting has become commonplace, or we don't find much value in what the day has in store.

I know I am guilty. I can begin to take for granted how wonderful my life is. I can begin to take the little things for granted. This morning, I recalled the words of that early follower of Jesus, Paul:

"Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, **with thanksgiving**, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:6-7)

Sometimes, I wake up and am already concerned about what the day has ahead. I can begin asking for relief or rescue from the things I am not looking forward to.

And this morning, I recalled "with thanksgiving."

Yes - I have a great deal for which to be grateful.

I once heard a quote which I am not sure to whom I should attribute:

Getting the Mix Right

You may have noticed over the last year that our worship team members put in ear buds or headphones when they are up on the platform leading. These are called "In-Ear Monitors" and they are used to help the musicians hear the other instruments and parts of the worship team. Each teammate can dial in and make their in-ears sound right to the needs of their specific ears. Part of getting this mix right is making sure the musician can hear at least a little of everything and then add in an increased amount of specific parts that help that musician to feel comfortable.

Scheduling teammates is also a delicate and somewhat challenging feat at times. It is funny how some weeks we have a number of servants available to serve, but they all play the same instrument. The next week not one of those same servants is available and that instrument role ends up being vacant that week! Getting the mix of servants right is crucial for the worship team to ensure that we are utilizing our collective gifts correctly. Our team is often strongest when the right blend of guitars, keys, strings, drums, and vocals is found. Often this means that a large team is used as the variety of instruments and voices allow us to offer fresh creative expression to the songs we lead and share. In addition, our team is strengthened by having a mix of leading voices and instruments and also those voices and instruments who are the supporting and supplemental parts. We need each member of our team to do what God calls us to do, but it matters from week to week who is serving and so it is critical to get the mix right.

Another way we have to get our mix right is in the 'front of house mix' which is the sound that you hear from being in the pews on a Sunday morning. The soundboard operator does not have an easy job as they seek to blend things in a way that allows the congregation to hear each part of the team, but they often must highlight the vocalist and instrument that is driving the song. When multiple people have a hand in leading songs on a Sunday, this means that the sound operator has to be ready to make adjustments. Often the 'front of house mix' is tough to nail down. I am thankful for volunteers who are seeking to learn and get this mix right!

Above the specifics of music, in-ears, servants, and front of house mixes, if we look at the words of Romans 12: 6-8 we will take note of the importance of the varied gifts. "We have different gifts, according to the grace given to each of us. If your gift is prophesying, then prophesy in accordance with your faith; if it is serving, then serve; if it is teaching, then teach; if it is to encourage, then give encouragement; if it is giving, then give generously; if it is to lead, do it diligently; if it is to show mercy, do it cheerfully." This scripture depicts a mix done right. I'm thankful to see each of these gifts displayed in our teammates and in us collectively as a team. Naomi Clugston and Olivia Chavez have developed a relationship where Naomi is able to encourage Olivia through the common shared interest of playing stringed instruments. Landon Harnish stepped up and led a song recently on the worship team. Conversations after rehearsal demonstrate mercy and compassion toward one another. Shawn Vago's
