A Pastor's Perception

I doubt many of you are thinking about Christmas cards right now—but if you want this year's card to include a recent photo, don't delay. Time has a way of changing us whether we notice it or not.

In our family, conversation has begun around family photos. And with it, the annual negotiations.

I once was of the opinion that as a family we do not look much different from year to year. Meaning we take all sorts of photos year round—there's no need for an annual "family photo." I was alone on this sentiment. Completely alone.

I'm not sure if Amanda was trying to make a point, but she displayed four different years of Noelle's field hockey pictures on the refrigerator. To say they were significantly different would be an understatement. The evidence was undeniable—I was wrong.

But once we start to talk about pictures, the conversation includes when and where. But also what are we wearing? And this is where things get complicated.

In order for the perfect photo, there are a lot of elements to consider. And perfect for one of us may not be perfect for another. For me, the solution would be simple: everyone in gray. Elegant. Foolproof. Unfortunately, I'm the only one in our house who sees it that way.

I don't know what it means for something to be perfect for you. For some, perfection is a perfectly cooked steak (though what's perfect for one person might look undercooked to another). Others might say it's a manicured lawn—I had neighbors who trimmed their grass with scissors! Or maybe it's a tidy collection of Hummels on the mantle.

In those examples (minus the steak) perfection seems to be something visible from the outside. How you and I might use our eyes to determine perfection. But if we are pursuing perfection, it becomes an ever moving target. Perhaps the steak, if it were cooked a minute longer or less, would have been even better. Maybe if I waited one more day to trim the grass it would have been perfect. Or perfection remains incomplete if a new Hummel is released (btw I don't even know if that is a possibility).

The target keeps moving because perfection, as we define it, doesn't actually exist. It's a mirage that disappears the closer we get to it. Our pursuit of the perfect photo—or the perfect steak, lawn, or living room—illustrates something deeper: our obsession with perfection. The trouble is, perfection is always a moving target. Just when you think you've got it, it slips away. That's not just true in family photos—it's true in life, too.

I think it is time we get Over Perfect.

It is unattainable and it diverts our attention away from our present circumstances. It robs us of joy that's happening right now while we chase something that doesn't exist. I listened to a story told in which a husband and father had an entire day planned at the beach to have fun and enjoy time together. On the walk there, his sons began to pick up pebbles and toss them at a log.

And his wife joined. His first response was the observation that this is not on the plan for the perfect day. But reality set in—what he planned and longed for was what was happening in that moment. His family was together and enjoying life. He almost missed it because it didn't match his script.

When Jesus says, "Be perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect," he's not talking about flawless performance or a picture-perfect moment. The Greek word *teleios* means complete, whole, mature. God's idea of perfect isn't our carefully curated Instagram post—it's the messy, real moment where love is happening.

The father at the beach almost missed the gift because it didn't match his plan. How often do we miss what God is offering us right now because we're fixated on our idea of what perfect should look like? How many moments of grace slip by while we're adjusting the lighting for a better photo?

Paul understood this. He had his thorn in the flesh—something that wouldn't go away no matter how much he prayed. God's response wasn't "try harder to be perfect." It was "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Not despite the imperfection—through it. God's strength shows up most clearly in our unpolished, unscripted, imperfect moments.

No one cares if my groutfit is perfect for our family photo. I doubt I will ever look back and think fondly of the time spent manicuring the perfect lawn. But I will remember the moments when we stopped trying to orchestrate perfect and started receiving what was actually being offered. The spontaneous conversations. The unplanned detours that became adventures. The messy dinners where everyone laughed too loud.

This October, we're going to talk about what it means to live *Over Perfect*: to step off the exhausting treadmill of impossible standards and notice the grace that meets us in the unplanned, imperfect, beautifully real moments of life.

When We Don't Prefer A Song -

The other Sunday we sang a song that I don't prefer. In planning and all the way through leading the song on Sunday morning, I grumbled sometimes out loud, under my breath and inside my mind about this song. I just felt like the song is very wordy and can be tricky for both the worship band and the congregation when we sing together.

But I was reminded of something - in my moment of grumbling, someone out loud stated that this is one of their favorite songs because of the lyrics. I was taken aback by this statement - like really??? This song?! Do they even understand what they are singing?!

So I decided to do a dive of the lyrics - "Your Kingdom is simple, as simple as love, You welcome the children, You stop for the one, We wanna see people the way Jesus does, Your kingdom is simple, Lord teach it to us..."

As I read those words, I was struck by the powerful depth of the lyrics - it is a reminder of who is welcomed at His table - the children (Matthew 19:14), the one (Luke 15)... and that lyric - "We wanna see people the way Jesus does..." - man that's a tough one.

Is that my prayer - to look at others and see them as Jesus does? To see them as siblings who belong to sit at the table of the Father? What a wake up call - His Kingdom is simple - Lord teach us your way - Help us to desire to love people the way that you do and look forward to that table where we'll all sit in the presence of our loving Lord.

So while this song may not be my preference, I was reminded that what we sing has meaning. If it is rooted in the Word of Life, our completely dependable source of truth, the Bible, despite our preferences, we can learn new truth about who God is and how He is at work in our midst.

So the next time we don't prefer a song used in a gathering, perhaps we can dig into the scripture and connect the lyrics. And perhaps we'll find that even despite our preferences, God is teaching us and revealing new truths to us about who He is, who we are and how we dive into a deeper relationship with Him.


