

Operation Teddy Bear: Coming and Going

The need for *Operation Teddy Bear* is heartbreaking: vehicle accident, domestic abuse, or a house fire. The comfort a little one receives after being given a bear to hug during an incident is heartwarming. The generous outpouring of our PIT Crew and individuals, and New Life Riders members as well has been incredible.

New Life Riders began collecting and distributing teddy bears in 2023 and, to date, we have delivered nearly 300 bears. First deliveries were to police stations, followed by rescue squads (at the suggestion of a police officer) and now we have moved to fire stations and second rounds to rescue squads and police stations. It is disheartening to have to resupply facilities as that means there have been at least ten situations since we made the first deliveries, but we are thankful for the tender hearts of those who continue to collect and donate bears.

We scrambled to find appropriate replacement bears once Walmart discontinued its beloved "Sparky" bear (see picture below). But bear buyers have not been thwarted. Thank you, Internet! The new bears may not be exact, but clever shoppers located Sparky's look-alike cousin (see the bottow row of bears, above right).

Except for Dave and Ron, most bikers are offroad til Spring, but New Life Riders continues its outreach through the winter. Thank you for partnering with us.


- Free United Airlines round trip ticket to Houston to meet up with my fellow mission volunteers.


