

A Weeklong "Movement of God"

APRIL 5-10: Pastor Dave Errickson opened Stockton Wesleyan and Old Rock (Lambertville) churches to host an old-time camp meeting. Dr. Streeter Stuart and his wife, Nancy, drove from the Lancaster area to preach in Stockton Saturday night, Sunday morning at Old Rock following Stockton's morning service, and again Sunday night in Stockton. Dr. Stuart emphasized how God focuses on "the one" (Luke 15: The lost sheep, lost coin, lost son; and John 4: The Samaritan woman at the well).

Dr. Harry Wood, driving each night from the Allentown area, spoke four nights at Old Rock. His messages included Audacious Belief (II Timothy), Power (II Corinthians), Emotional and Spiritual Healing (Psalm 23, with a call to be anointed with oil following the service), and A Blueprint for Turbulant Times (II Chronicles 7:11-22). One haunting question hung in the air: "Are we making a difference?"

Dr. Wood encouraged us not to call this a "revival" until a full year has passed, as it often takes that long to see results that confirm revival, but to term it a "movement of God." Gauging from the responses to the first through the final altar calls, we should be seeing a plentiful harvest!

Also as adjunct professor at Indiana Wesleyan University and Bethany Bible College, Sussex, Canada. Dr. Wood also served as the inaugural chairperson of the Wesleyan Seminary Foundation.

Absolutely Nothing About Bikes By Dave Stryker

Oh, my aching knees! Recently, I was working in a house that was being renovated. There was a lot of preparation work to do on the walls and trim. Taping and spackling cracks then sanding it all smooth. Also plenty of door and window frames, along with many feet of baseboard trim to prepare, vacuum, caulk, prime, and paint. All this work to be done with wide plank pine flooring underneath. With many drop cloths and plastic coverings, the work progressed.

As the days went on, I found myself moving foot by foot, yard by yard through the many rooms and halls. My knees were extremely sensitive to every little irregularity on the floors as I worked on the lower walls and baseboard. I have knee pads, but they irritate the back of my legs. I'm not kneeling in one place long enough to justify the use of a cushion; it's too inconvenient to keep pushing it ahead. I think of how God equipped the camels with knobby knees to bend down in the sand. I think how much more my knees could tolerate if when I prayed I literally got down on my knees.

The song sung by Jaci Velasquez comes to mind, titled *On My Knees*, goes something like this: "I've learned in laughter and in pain how to survive. I got on my knees. There's power when I get on my knees. Whether in a crowd or by myself, when I feel the need to talk to God, I get on my knees."

Of course, after being on my knees for so long, like the old man that I am, when I try to stand up I grunt a little and stretch out after getting up. A verse of the titled song

You Raise Me Up by Selah comes to mind. "When I am down and oh my soul so weary, You raise me up to walk the stormy seas. You raise me up to more than I can be."

I work there day after day in complete solitude. No one lives there to talk to, an occasional text message may come through,



but for the most part, it's me and my radio with WCHR 1040 playing as I listen to sermons. Occasionally, I have what I call "sandpaper moments" where I feel the nudge to jot down on the back of a piece of sandpaper what I feel God is putting on my heart.

Recently, the story from the magician Penn Jillette of the duo Penn and Teller fame came to mind. A man from the audience was asked to participate. He was a Gideon. After the show was over, with great passion, the man shared the gospel with Penn. Penn, an admitted atheist, listened and admired the man for his faith and willingness to share.

Penn questioned if Christians really believe those who die without Christ go to hell for eternity yet won't share their faith. "How much do you have to hate someone not to tell them how to get to heaven?" (Watch the video here.)

I heard this story many years ago and have retold it several times. This day, however, I pondered the word "hate." I thought, do we as believers, the Body of Christ, really hate people and that's why we don't share? I think it's more that we see people, walk or sit by people and think, "It's not my place to talk to them," or we really just don't care what happens to them. They did nothing to us for us to hate them, but we just don't love them enough to share the Good News that will keep them out of hell.

It's not love or hate or being hot or cold. It's apathy or being lukewarm. So, look up Relevation 3:15-16 and read what God thinks about those who are lukewarm.

Let's not become believers of indifference and idleness, not taking a stand or only being satisfied with ourselves. We need to go all in. As Barry Meguiar wrote in his book *Ignite Your Life*, we should be leading people closer to Jesus every day.

So there you have it. Absolutely nothing about bikes, but certainly what we as CMA members are called to do: *Change the world, one heart at a time.*
