50-Year Anniversaries: Joyful, Blessed, Revolutionary, Scary, Good, and Sad By Dave Stryker

This year, 2025, there are several 50-year anniversaries of notoriety and a couple on a personal level.

When we think of 50-year anniversaries one of the first things that comes to mind is a wedding anniversary. I only know of one couple in my family who lived long enough to celebrate the Big 50. My grandparents on my mother's side exceeded fifty years of wedded bliss and joy.

This year, the Christian Motorcyclists Association is celebrating fifty years of ministry. Herb Shreve began



CMA in 1975 with the intention of reaching lost bikers who might never step foot in a church. The vision of "changing the world one heart at a time" drew many to follow in his path and the worldwide ministry of CMA was born. We (New Life

Riders) had opportunity recently to join with nearly 1,300 CMA members in Altoona, Pennsylvania, for the CMA National Rally East. It was a spectacular event to meet others from across the country and begin new friendships while worshipping together. We were truly blessed.

1975 was the first year for the Honda Goldwing, a motorcycle with a 1000cc engine Honda thought would achieve superbike status, but quickly became the touring


motorcycle other brands would try to emulate. The aftermarket business went crazy, especially a company owned by Craig Vetter creating windscreens, saddlebags and trunks.



Five years later, Honda would design an upgraded model to the standard Goldwing and call it the Goldwing Interstate complete with a full fairing up front, saddlebags and touring trunk. Over the years, the engine size would be increased several times and become the 1800cc Goldwing. I happened to be fortunate enough to own one of the first year models. The bike was revolutionary.

In the entertainment world, it's been fifty years since the movie Jaws was released. This caused great concern for shore towns as people were scared to go into the water. The phrase "You're gonna need a bigger boat" became one of the greatest movie lines ever. I wonder if anyone ever said that to the disciples or Jesus. If we are fishers of men, do we need a bigger boat? Now to my life story fifty years ago. I'll call it the good and the sad. I was halfway through high school that summer. I was on my third dirt bike, starting out on a Honda 50 Mini Trail, moving up to a Honda SL 100 and then to a Honda XL 175. There were a handful of us guys who

had been moving up to bigger bikes over the years. We were grateful to the local farmers who gave us permission to ride around the perimeter of their fields and even leant us equipment to build a couple



tracks on fields they didn't use. We had a great layout of trails through much of East Amwell. This would be one of my best summers ever. It's hard to believe it was fifty years ago. Some of us had part time jobs during the day, some worked weekends. Jobs like golf caddying, pumping gas, mowing grass, working in a greenhouse, and all of us helped farmers with stacking haybales. When it came to riding, you never knew who would be your trail buddy.

We would camp out along the banks of the Backbrook, build a campfire, roll out the sleeping bags under the stars, hear the water flowing from the brook, toast marshmallows or pop Jiffy Pop popcorn. It was summertime so the sun came up early. There were times we never slept, staying up all night talking about riding, sports and girls. Occasionally, in the morning we would wipe the dew from our seats and ride over to someone's home and ransack the kitchen to make breakfast or plead with someone's

mom to cook us something. They almost always took pity on us and fixed a big meal. Our moms were great. It was a fantastic life for teenage boys. It was fifty years ago, yet the memories are timeless.



Life was good, then it all changed.

The saddest, hardest day of my life in 1975 came on Monday, July 28. I had left the house to go riding with a buddy. We rode a lot that day, had taken a break for lunch then rode some more. We parted on the trails to head back to our homes. Some of our trails around the fields ran close to the back roads, that's when I noticed my sister's

car. She was out looking for me and blowing the horn to get my attention. When I stopped, she yelled for me to get home immediately. What kind of trouble could I be in now, I thought?

I arrived at the house and saw a lot of cars in the driveway. I went inside and got the news that my Grandfather Stryker had a heart attack and died before getting to the hospital. I was devastated and hollered, "No! That's impossible!" Just the day before he died, I had been out riding my bike in the backyard down by his garden. He was watching me ride while he picked ripe vegetables to take into the house. Both he and my Grandmother had gone to Sunday evening church service. When they got home, I had ridden to the house to visit with them; my Grandfather was in his favorite chair in the living room reading his Bible. We talked awhile, it was getting late so I said good night, not goodbye, and went home. Those were the last words I would ever say to him. There would be no other nights to talk. I can't believe it was fifty years ago and he was only sixty years old at the time. That was the worst summer up to that time in my life.

Here I am, fifty years after that great loss but with a greater understanding of the man I called Grandpop. He loved the Lord and had



a heart for the lost and little ones who never heard about Jesus. Every Sunday morning he would leave the house early enough to fill his Chevy Impala with kids to take to Sunday School. After Sunday School he would drive them all back to their homes then return for what was left of the church service. I don't know the outcome of the lives of all the children my Grandfather drove to and from Sunday School but I know at a young age they heard about Jesus. They were shown

that someone cared about them and loved them. The Holy Spirit can bring back to mind at any age the most fundamental message. God's word does not return void.

Some people are destined to be recognized and have great notoriety. Some live under the radar and have a much smaller circle of influence. Without a written mission statement or vision my Grandfather was living a life Barry Meguiar encourages, "Moving everyone every day closer to Jesus. Or as CMA says, "Changing the world one heart at a time."

I doubt that at the end of my life my name will go down in history as a Herb Shreve or John Ogden, Sr., but if my name can be in the same sentence with followers of Jesus like Adonis T. Stryker that's a good enough legacy for me, and I'll be listening for the words: "Well done my good and faithful servant."

Thanks for all you taught me Grandpop, I've missed you for fifty years, but we'll have eternity to catch up.


Vietnam Memorial Replica
