CHAPEL MINISTRY

The Chapel Ministry at Camp Johnson continues to be blessed. One aspect of the ministry there is the weekly ELR Training session. ELR stands for Entrance Level Receiving and every Thursday I take part in a briefing for 50-200 Marines, depending on how many arrive on base each week from Paris Island and San Diego. I introduce the New Students to the Chapel Ministry, invite them out, hand out my business card from the Center and even do some quick counseling after the briefing. Many come to ask questions about getting back into church or other issues. For the last few weeks, the Chaplain has been away and has, as in the past, handed the briefing over to me to run. It's a great opportunity. It is a strange and wonderful feeling to be a civilian who was never in the military to be entrusted with an official Marine Corps staff briefing. Please keep praying the ministry on Johnson keeps being available to us. Every time a Chaplain moves (about every 2-3 years), we risk having our part in the Chapel ministry reduced. My heart is at Camp Johnson. The staff there have started calling me the Pastor of the Protestant Chapel. Having a place to preach every Sunday means so very much to me.

Over the last few months, two Marines have been a constant source of frustration, confusion, excitement, and great blessing. They come from very different worlds, but both are intelligent beyond their years and that has been a great hinderance to both as they question EVERYTHING. Through God's grace, I have seen both grow. I helped one to settle the heart issue of his salvation and baptized him about a month ago. The other is thinking about getting baptized again as a public testimony of his renewed commitment to Christ. BOTH have humbled themselves before a Holy God and are submitting to the leadership of their local churches and to my mentorship. As someone who only has two of his spiritual mentors still on the earth (of six), it is humbling and honoring to become the mentor to such young men of great faith and promise. When I came here seven years ago, I asked God for Timothy's. He is answering that prayer over and over again.
