

We received a gift of frozen Turkey breasts on Wednesday May 1. Over 500 lbs. of frozen Turkey breasts! The newly donated freezer was filled to the top, and we had to put more in the small chest freezer we already had. We distributed dozens of them to our Marine families, made Turkey Tacos, distributed more in the following weeks, and still have a full freezer. We had a small setback afterwards when we came to the Center after a long weekend and discovered our refrigerator (over 16 years old) had died completely and we lost everything in it! But God is faithful, more than enough came in through special offerings to replace it within a few days.
