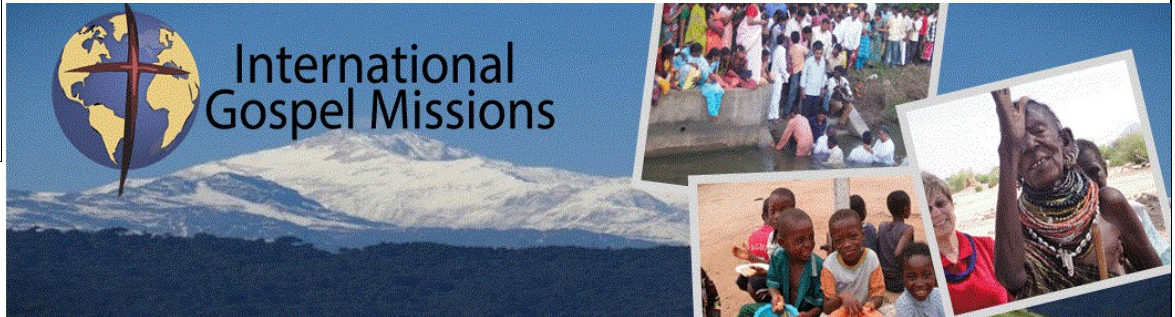

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Dear Faithful Prayer Partners and Financial Supporters,

Greetings in the precious Name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.

"But let all those that put their trust in thee rejoice: let them ever shout for joy, because thou defendest them: let them also that love thy name be joyful in thee. or thou, LORD, wilt bless the righteous; with favour wilt thou compass him as *with a shield*." Psalm 5:11-12

The month of December was pretty much challenging health-wise, especially during the second half of the month. Each one of us took turns becoming sick. Prior to that, we celebrated the first wedding at Eglise Baptiste Biblique Salem of Tamanyi. As it is custom to celebrate the wedding in the girl's church when the groom is from another church, it was a great time of rejoicing and a good example for the teens of the churches to witness this great milestone of life.

Our 8-passenger minivan, which we acquired in 2024, ran well for about a year before some major problems started. First, timing chains were replaced, and then some repairs were also performed on the transmission. Despite all the effort of the mechanics at two different shops, it still cannot be repaired. Some advised that it might need reprogramming. Repairs have not been attempted since October. This upset Samuel because the van had become his favorite care. Therefore, he wants us to repair it immediately.

Elisabeth, my wife, became sick during the last week of December. We spent three days at the clinic for care. On Wednesday, December 31st, the treatment was over, but as she was still weak, we didn't go to church to welcome the new year but stayed home.

In January, Koffi finished preaching a sermon series on the epistle to the Ephesians on Sunday mornings. He also completed the study on Revelation (The Revelation of Jesus Christ) using materials from Regular Baptist Press on Wednesday nights.

On January 31st, we mourned the passing of a dear brother in Christ who passed away after being sick for a while. He was the homekeeper and the guardian of the church property. This brother was persecuted in his village for his faith in Christ. But during the memorial service at the church of Tamanyi, 20 members of his family came as we shared his life story. The Gospel was preached, and I could hear some members of his family murmuring the sinner's prayer after Pastor Raymond who preached that day.



We made it to the US on March 27th. We praise God for Salem Baptist Church which has allowed us to stay in the mission house. As you already know, the main purpose of our travel is to get our son medical assistance and to help him with his ASD condition. We have begun the procedures to get him help and assistance. We already know how costly this is going to be and are certain that God will provide. Please continue to pray for Samuel.

Joshua and his family are doing well. In fact, the family had an addition on April 25th. A baby boy named Peter was born and baby and mama are doing well. To me, the girl, Eli Grace, is a princess. Now she has two bodyguards: big brother and little brother.

The ministry continues while we are away. Pastor Paul, who oversees the church of Kove reported that because of flooding, it was difficult to attend church two Sundays in a row. In fact, on Sunday, May 26th, heavy rain prevented people from accessing the church property. The service time became a workday as those who made it united to chase in vain the water from coming under the shelter. Also, during that time, one of the girls became very weak and fainted. Fortunately, she was taken to the nearest hospital a few blocks away where she was revived. Please pray for Appoline as she continues to recover.



We are so glad to have you as partners in reaching Togo with the Gospel of Christ.

As we have shared with you in the past, there is a need to buy land in the village of Ekpui for church planting. Please pray that the Lord will provide funds for this need.

The generator project for the church of Tamanyi and the computer project for the pastors are also open.

We finally got the building permit to build the classrooms upstairs and construction was to resume in May.
