OUTLINE 08/10/25 Love Your Neighbor as Yourself Leviticus 19 (NIV)

Main Idea: Jesus called Leviticus 19:18, "Love your neighbor as yourself," as the number two "great commandment" in all the law.

³⁵ Then one of them, a lawyer, asked Him a question, testing Him, and saying, ³⁶ "Teacher, which is the great commandment in the law?" ³⁷ Jesus said to him, "'You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.'

³⁸ This is the first and great commandment. ³⁹ And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' ⁴⁰ On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets." Matthew 22:35-40

How Can I Love My Neighbor?

1. I can be generous with my neighbor

- ⁹ When you reap the harvest of your land, you shall not wholly reap the corners of your field, nor shall you gather the gleanings of your harvest.
- ¹⁰ And you shall not glean your vineyard, nor shall you gather every grape of your vineyard; you shall <u>leave them</u> for the poor and the stranger: I am the LORD your God. Leviticus 19:9-10

2. I can be honest with my neighbor

- ¹¹ 'You <u>shall not steal</u>, nor deal falsely, <u>nor lie to one another</u>. ¹² And you shall not swear by My name falsely, nor shall you profane the name of your God: I am the LORD.
- ¹³ 'You shall <u>not cheat your neighbor, nor rob him</u>. The wages of him who is hired shall not remain with you all night until morning. ¹⁴ You shall not curse the deaf, nor put a stumbling block before the blind, but shall fear your God: I am the LORD. Leviticus 19:11-14

3. I can act justly with my neighbor

- ¹⁵ 'You shall <u>do no injustice</u> in judgment. You shall <u>not be partial</u> to the poor, nor honor the person of the mighty. In righteousness you shall judge your neighbor.
- ¹⁶ You shall not go about <u>as a talebearer among your people</u>; nor shall you take a stand against the life of your neighbor: I am the LORD. ¹⁷ 'You shall not hate your brother in your heart. You shall surely ^[b] rebuke your neighbor, and not bear sin because of him.
- ¹⁸ You <u>shall not take vengeance</u>, nor bear any grudge against the children of your people, but you shall <u>love your</u> **neighbor as yourself**: I am the LORD. Leviticus 19:15-18
