2 Peter 1:3-21 (NIV)

God's Word is trustworthy and powerful.

1. God's promises give us power for living.

³ His <u>divine power has given us everything we need for life and godliness</u> through our knowledge of him who called us by his own glory and goodness. ⁴ Through these <u>he has given us his very great and precious promises</u>, so that through them you may participate in the divine nature and escape the corruption in the world caused by evil desires.

⁵ For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; ⁶ and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance; and to perseverance, godliness; ⁷ and to godliness, brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness, love. ⁸ For if you possess these qualities in increasing measure, they will keep you from being ineffective and unproductive in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. ² Peter 1:3-8

2. God's Son has many eyewitness testimonies.

¹⁶ We did not follow <u>cleverly invented stories</u> when we told you about the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but <u>we were eyewitnesses of his majesty</u>. ¹⁷ For he received honor and glory from God the Father when the voice came to him from the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, whom I love; with him I am well pleased."

¹⁸ <u>We ourselves heard this voice</u> that came from heaven when we were with him on the sacred mountain. ¹⁹ And we have the word of the prophets made more certain, and you will do well to pay attention to it, as to a light shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. 2 Peter 1:16-18

3. God's Holy Spirit speaks the truth of scripture.

²⁰ Above all, you must understand that <u>no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet's own interpretation</u>. ²¹ For prophecy never had its origin in the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit. 2 Peter 1:20-21
