Mary McLaurine gets lost every single day. She lives with a condition known as developmental topographical disorientation—DTD. People with DTD cannot form a mental map of their surroundings. There's no internal compass, no intuitive sense of direction, no ability to picture where they are in relation to anything else.

Mary tells the story of visiting a friend's house and taking the dog for a short walk. Just a few blocks from the front door, she found herself completely disoriented. She writes, "Fear and adrenaline pulsed through my veins and I began to sweat profusely. My surroundings looked completely unfamiliar. It was as though I'd been dropped into the middle of a foreign land." Every step felt like a guess. Every turn could lead her farther away. Thankfully, someone eventually recognized her and guided her safely home.

What makes DTD particularly startling is that it's not caused by brain injury or trauma. Doctors still don't fully understand why some people experience it. But imagine carrying that sense of fear and uncertainty with you every day—never guite knowing where you are, never sure of how to get back.

Most of us may not live with DTD, but all of us know what it feels like to be lost. Maybe not geographically, but emotionally, spiritually, or relationally. The same panic Mary describes—confusion, fear, the tightening in your chest—can rise up when life throws us into unfamiliar territory. When you don't know which way to turn, or how to get back to where you once felt safe.

And yet, as frightening as it is to be lost, the feeling of being found is one of the most powerful gifts a human being can experience. The relief. The grounding. The sudden, overwhelming sense that you're not alone, that you are safe, that you are home.

That is the heartbeat behind our 2026 theme: "Found."

Throughout the coming year, every Sunday has been shaped around this simple but profound idea—what it means for us to be found by Christ, and what it means to live as people who have been found. We will explore themes like Finding Jesus in the Gospel of Mark, Finding Truth (our hot topic series), Finding Forgiveness, Finding Family, Finding God, Finding Our Mission, Finding Joseph (our OT study), Finding Leaders (study through 1 Timothy), and next Christmas, Finding Jesus.

In 2025, we encouraged you to grow in your understanding of Scripture through memory work. This year, we want to invite you into a deeper, richer life of prayer. Each month we'll introduce a different aspect or practice of prayer, and throughout the month we'll create spaces for you to try, reflect, and grow.

Our prayer is that these words from Luke 15:24 would become your story over and over again: "For this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.' So they began to celebrate.

So let's make 2026 a year of celebrating what it means to be found. Let's open our arms wide to people who are lost emotionally, spiritually, or simply wondering where they belong. And let's invite them to discover Christ with us—so that we can rejoice together when they, too, are found.
