

February 4 – *All In: Expand*

Icebreaker:

Think of something in your life that was meant to be shared—news, a skill, a resource, or an experience.

- What happens when something meant to be shared is kept to yourself?
- How does that connect to the idea that our faith was never meant to stay “in here”?

Discussion Questions

1. From “In Here” to “Out There”

This series has followed a progression: *encourage* → *engage* → *equip* → *expand*.

- Which of these steps feels most natural for you right now?
- Which step feels most challenging, and why?

2. Addition vs. Multiplication

The sermon contrasts Jesus-in-the-flesh (addition) with the Holy Spirit-in-every-believer (multiplication).

- How does this change the way you view your role in God’s mission?
- What would it look like to trust the Holy Spirit more instead of relying on your own ability or confidence?

3. “While You Are Going...”

Jesus’ command to “go” assumes movement—it’s about disciple-making in everyday life.

- Where has God already placed you (work, family, school, neighborhood) that could be your “Jerusalem”?
- What might disciple-making look like there in simple, relational ways?

4. ALL Authority, ALL Nations, ALL the Time

The Great Commission repeats the word *ALL*—authority, people, obedience, and presence.

- Which “ALL” stands out to you most right now?
- How does Jesus’ promise to be with us always address fear, doubt, or hesitation about expanding our faith?

Takeaway:

An *All In* life doesn’t stop at personal growth—it moves outward in Spirit-empowered obedience. We are not called to save people, but to faithfully **go, share, and teach**, trusting the Holy Spirit to bring multiplication.

This week, ask God to show you **one person** and **one step** you can take to live out the call to *expand*—remembering that what God does *in you* is meant to flow *through you*.
