Ask yourself these questions:

For the next minute, write a specific question about a difficult situation that you are facing.

- Search the Scripture for an answer. In the back of a good study Bible, there is typically a “concordance”, or an alphabetical listing of words used in the Bible text. This search will likely not be complete in 60 seconds... so this is homework! Spend the next few days searching for an answer, and being quiet in front of the Lord.
- If you have questions, reach out to a trusted Christian friend or pastor for help.

PRAISE

- During the closing song, focus your praise on God’s power, knowledge, and presence.
- Praise God as you think back on the ways that God has been faithful through this series. A verbal response of “Hallelujah” is a great way.
- Believe that God has heard your prayers as you end with a strong ‘AMEN’.
