From the Pastor:

This Spire will arrive in your in-box or mail box in the midst of Holy Week, and there are numerous opportunities for us to gather as we honor the Lord Jesus, remembering his final days, crucifixion, and resurrection.

- Daily devotionals, with scripture readings and prayers about the week, are being sent.
- Thursday, April 1, is Maundy Thursday. (Its name comes from the Latin word mandatum, 'command or 'mandate'.) It reflects John 13:44, where Jesus, on the night before his death, declared, "A new commandment I give you: love one another." Our sanctuary will be open from 7:00 to 8:00 pm, and during that time you are welcome to come and sit quietly, and when ready, to receive communion. There will also be opportunity to personally receive prayer for anything, including family or marital heartaches; grief and loss; physical and emotional hurts; addictions, whether your own/others.
- On **Good Friday, April 2**, the sanctuary will be again be open from 12:00 to 3:00 pm in recognition of Christ's time on the cross. Communion and specific prayer will be available from 12:00 to 1:00 pm; the sanctuary will remain open for prayer and reflection until 3:00 pm
- On **Saturday evening, April 3**, the Mission Team is hosting an in-person meal at 5:30 pm in the social room for Elisha and Crystal Stock, missionaries in Africa. The congregation is invited to come and hear of their ministry.
- On **Easter Sunday morning, April 4**, we will once again host the Stocks with a breakfast gathering at 9:00 am, and welcome them as they speak briefly at our worship service at 10:30 am. I will be preaching from 1 Corinthians 15, and in music and prayer, we will celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and Savior.

Through it all, we will be following suggested guidelines for gathering safely, as we "love our neighbor as ourselves."

Through April, I will continue preaching through the book of James, concluding on May 2. On May 9, Mother's Day, we will be hearing from several women as they reflect on what it means to live as disciples of Jesus in their roles as mothers.

It is a little late to wish you all the Lord's richest blessing for the New Year but nonetheless our prayers and affection accompany you all. We were so blessed to see a double portion, \$400, in the transfer of funds at the end of January. It arrived as we had just received news from Madagascar that our friends at the orphanage were about to pick up a baby boy whose mother died giving birth. As with the birth of twins the people tend to blame the baby and say that it is under a curse. We were able to transfer money immediately so that they could pick up the baby and have suitable food and clothing for the trip back to the capital.

We also sent some money to help the older ones six of whom graduated from their high school studies and were beginning specific diploma studies to prepare for work - nursing, computer technology, tourism, agriculture etc. This is a huge step for them all when we look back to where they came from. I am attaching a mail with some pictures of one girl who just "graduated", succeeded in a diploma qualifying her as a midwife. I met Florida eleven years ago when she was quite small. A couple in our church here have sponsored her and here she is, an adult with good training and hope for her future. We saw her in recent years as a teacher of the young in Sunday school and co-leader of a scout troop for young teenagers. She has a real desire to communicate her faith and a vision to return to her home area and open a Christian clinic for pregnant mothers and babies. You are our team bringing hope and faith to such as Florida and the Lord is at work. Many thanks once again for your gifts and your prayers. The Lord bless and prosper your ministry there in Waynesburg.
