# Kings Gospel Mission: Thank You

We recently received this **Thank You** letter from the King's Gospel Mission:

November 18, 2025

Happy Thanksgiving from Kings Gospel Mission – Your generosity fills us with gratitude: Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good; his love endures forever. – 1 Chronicles 16:34

As we reflect on 2025 and all God has done at Kings Gospel Mission we are humbled with thanks to our great God who sees, knows, and provides above and beyond what we can hope. Further more we are

filled with gratitude to you, our supporters, and how God has used you to further the work of Kings Gospel

mission in Kings County.

Exactly a year ago we parted ways with our prior manager and the Board of Directors was scrambling to fill the void and keep Kings Gospel Mission operational. We were facing severe financial shortfalls and even had the power shut off temporally at our downtown thrift store. With fervent prayers we reached out to our local church community; requesting fincancial help and explaining the circumstance of the change in management and our dire need. God responded through you and critical funds were raised to keep the doors open, allowing us to serve about 45 men and 8 women each day with shelter, food, and opportunities for spiritual growth, discipleship and salvation through the Gospel message.

Since then it has been a journey of stretching our faith and God's provision continued as we spent the year addressing needs. We had moments of plenty where the budget was met and everything operating smoothly. But also times of difficulty with new issues such as discovering IRS payroll tax had been unpaid in 2023 or a water pipe bursting in the middle of the night. Through it all God provided

enough each time and the work of Kings Gospel Mission continued without pause. There are several needs that remain but we continue to make progress and focus on being faithful to the work God has placed before us.

We would not be here today to serve our community without You! To say we are thankful is an understatment. The men and women served at Kings Gospel Mission express their sincere thankfulness to you for your faithful support. God has richly blessed Kings Gospel Mission through you.

#### Testimony from Scott, a current Mens New Song Academy member:

"My experience with Kings Gospel Mission started with me just wanting to get out of the cold and from sleeping in my car. What I didn't know yet was that God was going to work a miracle of change in

life through the mission. After I spent some time in the shelter I learned about the opportunity to join the academy and while I was nervous to make such a big change in my life, I finally joined. Since then God has broken many strongholds over my physical daily life and my mental struggles. I am now surrounded by many people I consider my family in Christ and I would not have it any other way. I am beyond grateful for Kings Gospel Mission and God's guidance being a turning point in my life. I now look forward to seeing what God has for my future."

# KGM Needs & Ministry Opportunities

RE: Kings Gospel Mission – 2026 Mission Projects

We have identified the following improvements and projects for the upcoming year (2026) and we are seeking community partners interested in helping improve our Mission facilities here in Hanford, Ca. The list below is ordered by priority and intended to be an overview.

#### Roof Repair – 805 and 801 Buildings

- -The 805 building (Men's shelter, Middle building) a roof vent location that has developed a leak.
- -The 801 Building (Women's, West Building has some roof shingles that need to be replaced and or repaired.

#### AC Replacement

-The 807 Building (Transitional Housing, East Building) had a main AC unit go out the end of September 2025. The technicians informed us the unit needs to be replaced. Cost estimate was roughly \$ 12,000

#### Mission Facilities Projects

-Exterior Siding repair - patch and repair exterior stucco

- -Interior Flooring Several rooms in our mission housing can use updated flooring
- -Bathroom Update Update bathroom flooring, fixtures and appliances

#### **Mission Shade Structures**

-We have two outdoor areas that are used for our unhoused guests. Currently both are covered by tarps we would like a more permanent structure at both locations. This could be an outdoor patio type structure or something like a playground shade structure.

#### <u>Host / Lead - Kings Gospel Mission Fundraiser Event</u>

- The Summer months are where we experience our highest costs. We would love to have help hosting a fundraising event(s) prior to the end of summer to help offset the higher costs. This could be a dinner, a giving drive, a race or other community event.
- -Timing Spring through Early Summer 2026

#### **Mission Meals**

-We are always open to community partners that want to join us as we provide meals every day. This can be dinner or breakfast to go items.

#### **Mission Volunteer Options**

- -We have several opportunities for men and women's bible study leaders and vocational teaching/ training/ mentoring.
- -We request that this would be a yearlong commitment with a minimum of two meeting times per month.


