

QUICK REVIEW:

As you reflect on your Sermon Guide Notes for this week's message, what was one key take-away that you'd like to discuss with your group?

CONFESSION

"At the heart of God is the desire to give and to forgive." *Richard Foster*

GOD'S STORY / OUR STORY

Read: 1 Peter 2:9

After reading this passage, what does scripture tell us about confession?

Read: 1 Timothy 2:5 and James 5:13-16

Confession is a very intimate and vulnerable act, and while we understand the need for private confession we often shy away from corporate confession. Why is it important to corporately confess?

The call to confession is a call to live in honesty and truthfulness with our brothers and sisters, no matter how we have fallen. How do you feel about sharing your sinfulness with your group (or another person)? Why?

Read John 20:19-23

Social Media has allowed many of us to live a public life where we can choose what to share and what to keep private. Tell of a time when you, or someone you know, shared honestly (vulnerably) about their failure (sinfulness) in a public way. How did you respond to them?



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DIGGING DEEPER

Read: John 20:19-23 (again), Matthew 26:28,

As followers of Christ, we have been given the authority to receive the confession of sin, and to forgive it in His name. Have you ever desired to share your failure (sinfulness) with another person but chose not to?

What do you think prevented you from sharing with them?

Tell of a time when <u>you</u> shared with another person about a difficult and personal failure (sin). How did they respond to your confession?

Where could you use Jesus' "peace" right now?

ADDITIONAL SELF-STUDY (Optional)

"The Discipline of confession brings an end to pretense. God is calling into being a Church that can openly confess its frail humanity and know the forgiving and empowering graces of Christ. Honesty leads to confession, and confession leads to change.

Spend some time this week focusing in the Word as you explore the idea of confession and forgiveness. Share with your group any takeaways you may have. If you feel comfortable, confess your sins to your group.
