


## THE BREASTPLATE OF RIGHTEOUSNESS WEEK 2 - 4/23/23

Go through the questions and think about how you might answer them. We've provided space in the study for you to write down your answers if you'd like.




# INTELLIGENCE BRIEFING

Apple founder Steve Jobs was famous for stealing other people's ideas and taking credit for their innovations. While working with a group of engineers to develop the Macintosh computer, he hung a pirate flag in their office because they stole the idea for a graphical user interface from Xerox. He was fond of the saying, "Good artists borrow, but great artists steal." We LOVE to take credit for what we do. Some, if they can get away with it, love to take credit for what others have done. In Paul's letter to the Corinthians, he wants the church to know EXACTLY who earned their righteousness - it's Jesus Christ. He also wants them to know that they cannot take any credit for their righteousness. To do so is to be a pirate, stealing from God's glory. The LORD wants us to put on HIS righteousness and to give glory, honor, and praise to Jesus for earning our righteousness.

# HISTORY OF THE CONFLICT

The church in Corinth was a mess. Satan targeted it, and he was waging a successful campaign against the believers in the highly pagan city. The Apostle Paul in his letter to the Corinthian church recounts their divisiveness (1:11-12), acceptance of sexual immorality (5:1-2), and litigiousness (6:1). What was the problem? The Corinthians were focused on elevating themselves - their status, their desires, their power - than elevating and glorifying the LORD. How could the Corinthians turn things around? Put on the breastplate of righteousness.

II. When a parent puts on the breastplate of righteousness, does it protect the children as well? Explain your answer.


