expectations, and that both mom and baby leave the hospital healthy.







Library Update

Greetings from your library! For kids 9-12 we have a couple of books to read about LarryBoy. Also, for those of you who are interested in westerns, author Al Lacy has written two series that are connected have a Western theme.

<u>For Kids</u>: <u>LarryBoy and the Emperor of Envy</u>: The city of Bumblyburg's in danger and LarryBoy's the only one who can save the day. Everyone is weak with jealousy after the diabolical Napoleon of Crime and Other Bad Stuff—a.k.a. the Emperor of Envy— tainted the Slushee supply with his envy formula during Mister Slushee's Slushee Slurping Contest. What will LarryBoy do? Will he conquer his own envy?

<u>LarryBoy Versus the Volcano</u>: When LarryBoy and his superhero buddies are invited to Superhero Island, they are in for a surprise of volcanic proportions. Trouble erupts when LarryBoy discovers he's a second-class citizen, because he doesn't have "super" powers

Journeys of the Stranger by Al Lacy: (1) Legacy: Finding citizens of Riverton, Wyoming held in a grip of fear, John Stranger assumes the identity of a new pastor. Using a Bible and a Colt .45, can he free the town and bring a young man out of corruption? (2) Silent Abduction: The man in black and the woman he loves help a small town targeted by cattle rustlers. Can the Stranger keep Jim Logan's family from destruction and rescue a beautiful woman separated from the man she loves? (3) Blizzard: When three murderers escape from the Colorado Territorial Prison, Marshal Hollowy and the mysterious stranger track them down. A thrilling tale of faith, soul-stirring love, and a violent family vendetta. (4) Tears of the Sun: John Stranger is summoned to Apache Junction, Arizona, where a hard-fought land dispute between the local Apache and Zuni Indians has led to the wedding-day kidnapping of the son of Arizona's governor. As terms for his return, the warriors demand weapons that can only escalate the fighting between the tribes, as well as the white men who come to the area looking for gold or-as it's known to the Indians-"Tears of the Sun." (5) Circle of Fire: John Stranger works to break up an eight-man band of night riders who are terrorizing local ranchers near Billings, Montana. As he works to bring justice to the outlaws, John remains unaware that another "stranger" has adopted his identity and is robbing and murdering people in the area. Can the Stranger clear his name? (6) Quiet Thunder: John Stranger becomes involved in the lives of a brave and skillful Sioux warrior named Quiet Thunder and the white Army captain who has been his blood brother since childhood. Despite the disapproval of both their people, Quiet Thunder and Thane Tyler remain faithfully true to their friendship...both in their hearts and on the battlefield. Which will win out: love or duty? (7) Snow Ghost: John Stranger is called in to track the "ghost" of a murder he captured three years earlier, in Butte, Montana -- a man who had vowed to come back from the grave to kill the judge, the jury, Sheriff Johnson ... and John Stranger. Now, the jury members are turning up dead. Certain that the killer is no phantom, the Stranger sets out to find the true murderer and bring him to justice in Snow Ghost. Return of the Stranger by Al Lacy: (1) Outlaw Marshal: For Chief U.S. Marshal John "The Stranger" Brockman, becoming a friend to former outlaw Whip Langford is easy. Saving his life is more complicated. With John Brockman strongly encouraging him to accept salvation, former outlaw Whipley Langford determines to go straight. He won't turn his life over to Christ, but he won't go back to a life of robbing banks and trains either. Whip intercepts a train robbery and catches two of the thieves, but is framed for murder. John must ride hard and fast to save his friend from the noose. (2) Deadlock: are seasoned outlaws with a reputation for killing. Already wanted in two states, The Zarbo brothers, set their sights on Colorado and a string of bank robberies. They don't count on running into Chief U.S. Marshal John Brockman. (3) The Iron Wagon: At twenty-one, Paul Brockman is the newest deputy U.S. marshal in his father's arsenal of lawmen. Bold and courageous, Paul proves to be every bit as skillful with a revolver as the chief U.S. marshal, John "The Stranger" Brockman. During a hazardous journey, Paul encounters Lisa Martin, whose parents were murdered by renegade Indians. She desperately needs his help and Paul is just the deputy to help. Could she be the answer to his prayers for a wife?


