

Greetings from your library! If you missed the last two books of Stephen Bly's series Fortunes of the Black Hills we presented in a previous newsletter, you'll want to finish up with these two books.

(5) Last of the Texas Camp: Dacee June Fortune's mother died when she was eight, and for the next 23 years she stood at her father's side. The date was November 19, 1997, and with the births of the only living septuplets in the world, Kenny and Bobbi McCaughey and their children became one of the most famous families in America. Their story is not only of the history-making births, but also of the support of the community of Carlisle, Iowa, and of the Christian faith of a family that has captured the imagination of the nation and the world.


