To me, it's really a continuation of "Forward in Faith," an outgrowth of that process we began in 2015 with the major focus on refurbishing Luther Hall. With the excellent work done in that process, your exuberant participation, and a wonderful outcome, it feels like we already laid the groundwork for what lies before us now.

As I write this, I am painfully aware of the fact that we cannot meet as a church on Sunday morning. The option does exist to hold worship services outside, with numerous safety procedures in place for up to 60 people, however, since our congregation is mostly made up of those who are in a more tenuous age bracket, including your pastor (!), we have felt it wise to refrain from meeting together as of yet. That's painful for us, and for me personally. There have been many instances in the past months that I felt it important to be present to people going through crises, while the directions we receive from those in authority have prohibited just that. As our people suffer loss, health and surgical issues, family crisis, and difficult decisions, we have prayed heartfelt prayers from a distance, knowing that God is present to all of us through this time and circumstance. And I know it works, but it isn't how I'd like it to be – anyone feel that way too?

We look toward the time when we may all be back together again, prayerfully sooner than later. In the meantime, know that you are loved and cared for, that united in purpose and moving "Forward in Faith" even in these trying times we can work at being a "Healthy Church Thriving." May God bless you all!

## *Healthy Churches Thrive - The Next Chapter In A Great Story*

Eons ago a story began. Like any wonderful story worth retelling, it began with a relationship, a romance, promises exchanged and then promises broken. God created us for relationship with Him but we turned away. As the story progresses there are more ups and downs in this relationship, wonderful reunions and bitter betrayals (by God's people). Then God sets forth his Son to wipe away the burden of sin and death

so we may return to him with glad hearts and start living lives full of his promise. Thousands, millions came to hear the story and be part of its making - weaving their lives with HIS. On August 1, 1954, Gloria Dei Lutheran Church was founded, sharing and continuing the story of God's Grace and Redeeming presence in our lives. We continue the story today in 2020. So we invited Church Doctors and their Healthy Church's Thrive Ministry to help us.

In February, Tracee Swank travelled to Gloria Dei from her home in Ohio for an onsite evaluation and visit. She explored our campus and our community and interviewed many members of the congregation. Shortly after this visit, a new challenge arose as we began dealing with COVID-19 - a pandemic which caused us to reinvent how we worship and made consultation with Tracee and her team at Church Doctor's nearly impossible. We waited anxiously to hear her team's results and recommendations. However, as with every wonderful story and everything blessed by God, this was not the end.

On July 27<sup>th</sup>, Tracee was able to share the findings from her visit. We learned that like many congregations, our numbers had decreased as our age increased. We learned that our corner of White and Rose posed many challenges but also offered terrific opportunities. We learned that years of attending small groups, and listening to the Word had grown us spiritually and endowed us with an abundance of gifts ready to continue God's Work here at Gloria Dei.

Now we start the next chapter of Gloria Dei's part of His Story. With report in hand, an **Action Plan Task Force** has been created. This team's volunteers are Libby Nelson, Pastor Pat, Ben Tobin, Joyce Boddie, Jon Kromrey and myself, Wendy Kromrey. This team is looking at the recommendations in the Church Doctor's Report. As this team prayerfully considers each suggestion, we work to create a **three-year plan** of community outreach and growth for Gloria Dei. We also seek individuals with the spiritual gifts and talents to help us write these plans. We have started creating plans to improve the safety and appearance of our church. We are examining our Health Ministries and finding ways to reach more people and finding resources to support what we already do. We are also working on plans to reach visitors who simply stop to rest under our tree or are here to visit the food pantry and preschool. Ann Fitzgerald is crafting a prayer team and ministry to support the Action Plan Task Force and the planning process as well as all members and ministries of Gloria Dei. Always we pray and seek what God's purpose is for Gloria Dei. For just as God's Church has people with many different gifts and talents, so each church is uniquely equipped and has a unique part to play for God's purpose in this place.

## *Church Doctors Purpose: Prayer*

## *Leadership Team Corner -September 2020:*

Leadership Team Meeting was held on August 18, 2020. Here are some highlights:

Healthy Churches Thrive- Wendy Kromrey has begun using the Servant Keeper software for information on Spiritual Gifts. Please make sure you send your Spiritual Gifts form to her.

The Prayer Team and Action Plan Taskforce have begun to meet. The Action Plan Taskforce is working on recommendations for Outreach and Buildings and Grounds/Security.

Solar Project- Progress is moving slowly, but it's moving. Santa Clara County requires that new solar systems must be placed on roofs less than 5 years old. Roofing bids were submitted for re-roofing the peaked portions of Luther Hall and the ELC. K-12 recommended a proposal from ACME Roofing for \$21,500 (not including gutters) be accepted. K-12 provided information on a Loan Program sponsored by the County for Energy Saving Devices. The Team discussed possible alternatives to this and by consensus agreed to use Church Savings to pay for the roof replacement.

ELC- The staff is preparing for the Fall. They are expecting at least 11 students. Things look promising for the next school year.

Playground improvements are on the agenda- seeking a grant to pay for these. Still hoping this will happen.

Fencing around the front of the ELC building – The fencing was nearly complete on Tuesday the 18th. It is expected to be done soon.

Lord's Pantry- Business continues to be brisk. There is a good flow of food from Second Harvest and other providers. The Clothes Closet is temporarily closed due to an insect infestation and when it reopens, will have limitations on accepting clothes. Volunteers are currently adequate. The Board Meeting to be held next week.

Parish Nurse –In May, Donna served over 100+individuals through home visits, and many phone calls. She even does Convalescent Home visits, through the windows. She continues to deliver Brown Bag program food to several of our shut-ins. Her Health Ministry Corner articles are sent out by Constant Contact each week. GDLG Finances/Budget – As the shelter in place order continues, we are maintaining the normal salaries and benefits for our employees and staff. Our income is stable and doing reasonably well. Members are encouraged to use the “digital” platforms to make their tithes and offerings. If you need help with any of the plans, feel free to contact Dan Rinerson, who can help!

Worship Activities- Group Studies will resume the first week of August. We’re planning to do “drive through” communion the first Sunday of each month.

No change in sight for a return to normal Worship Services, but we’ll let you know as things change. The IMDC has begun having outdoor services on Sundays following all the County requirements (temperatures, size, space requirements).

Our delightful Office Administrator, Stacey Dier, moved in late July. We have been advertising for another Administrator on CraigsList and other websites and will have received some resumes. We will begin interviewing soon. If you know someone who is looking for this type of position, please let Libby know (408-594-5857).

### **September is Fruit and Veggie Month.**
