"Remember that you are dust,
and to dust you shall return."



Lent is almost here. The weeks of Lent are not the most beloved on the church calendar. The days are dark and cold. The season of Lent begins with ashes and ends at the tomb. Lent is to be a time of repentance, penance, and fasting. Lent is seen as a time focused on our inadequacies. That all sounds like such a downer, no wonder no one has ever marketed Lent with greeting cards and t-shirts.

But what if Lent isn't meant to be depressing? What if we are missing the point?

A time of preparation and fasting leading to Easter has likely been practiced since apostolic times. The observance was recognized at the First Council of Nicea in 325 as a time of preparation for new converts who wanted to be baptized and as a time of repentance and contrition for sinners. The basic idea is to set aside forty days (not counting Sundays, which are seen as "mini-Easters"), imitating the struggles Jesus faced as he fasted in the wilderness. After experiencing self-denial, Jesus was able to take on all the temptations of Satan and begin his ministry fully empowered. By practicing simplicity and self-control, Christians confront their cravings and hungers as a reminder to pray with an attitude of dependence on God. At the limits of our own strength we discover greater power. Instead of fixating on ourselves, we set our sights on the Lord. Instead of being overcome by our challenges, we find ourselves overwhelmed by God's presence. Instead of fretting about what we are missing out on in life, we are being recreated in the fullness of life the Lord offers us. We practice giving something up so we will learn to not give up. As Paul writes, "Whenever I am weak, then I am strong" (2 Corinthians 12:10).

We get the word Lent from the Old English *lencten*—as in the lengthening of days that occurs with the coming of spring. In other words, as we move through Lent we experience more light, more illumination, so that Easter morning will burst out in full glory.

So Lent isn't dreary after all. Lent is a season of joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.

as of Dec 31, 2025

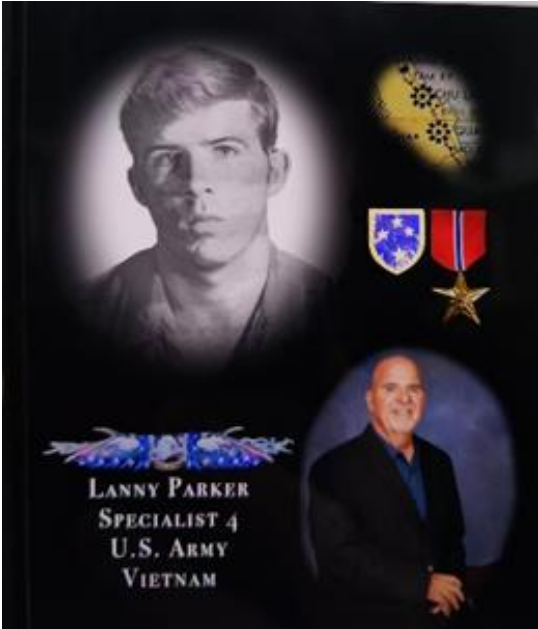


2025 Year-End Financial Summary

Veteran Voices: Celebrating 250 Years as a Nation

What influenced your decision to serve in the military?

Honestly, my life had no direction or goals for living life on life's terms. I had no home to call home, no place to go, and I was only 17 years old. I needed my parents' approval, and they said yes—*"maybe you will make something of yourself, become a man."* Little did I know then that **discipline** was—and still is—the key to achieving long-term goals in life.

Which branch did you serve in and during what years?

On July 19, 1968, I volunteered to join the U.S. Army for two years. My service number began with *RA*, which meant, *"You volunteered for this, Lanny—it wasn't the draft."*

Military Service:

- **March 1969 – July 1970:** One month after turning 18, I was placed on orders to serve in Vietnam (USARV). I was honorably discharged with the rank of SP/4.

- **February 1977 – February 1981:** I joined the 32nd Separate Infantry Brigade (Mechanized), Red Arrow, Wisconsin National

Guard in Neillsville, Wisconsin. I achieved the rank of SGT (E-5) and was honorably discharged with a total of **9 years, 11 months, and 13 days** of service.

Decorations, citations, and ribbons include:

- NDSM, BSM, VSM, VCH, ACM, ANGRB, 1-O/S BAR
- Marksman: M-14, M16 A-1

What is one experience from your service that helped shape who you are today?

The ability to bounce back from adversity and continue to persevere in the face of life's obstacles. Resilience has allowed me to adapt to change, overcome setbacks, and remain humble through life's most challenging experiences.

What skills or lessons from your military service have stayed with you in civilian life?

Respect for life—and for others. Respect costs nothing; **disrespect costs everything**.

"Adapt and overcome" is something I live by. I often step up without an invitation or instructions because it is the right thing to do. Don't wait—do what's right. Stay humble. *The best leaders don't chase glory; boastful leaders come and go.*

What does being a veteran mean to you now?

The value of **service**. I have an "Honor Walk" outside my home that proudly flies the American flag. I would do it all over again in a heartbeat.

Freedom comes with a cost—some gave it all. Being a veteran is an investment in building personal character, something I did not have at age 17. It is an honor for me to serve. *How may I help you today?*

Is there a person or group you served with that you're especially grateful for?

Fifty-eight years ago this July, I joined the U.S. Army. But it's not just the Army—every branch of the service shares one calling: **to protect and serve**.

There is unity within all the armed forces, grounded in respect and dignity. A veteran is someone who, at one point in life, writes a blank check payable to the United States of America for up to and including their life.

I am especially grateful to all who accept the call to serve our country. Of special note, my granddaughter—age 23—volunteered to join the United States Navy and was sworn in on January 9, 2026.

Answer the Call: Kairos Prison Ministry

I answered my call to prison ministry in 2002 when I joined Kairos Prison Ministry. I felt the Holy Spirit convicting me to step outside of my comfort zone, to enter His service outside of our church, and into the Wallis Pack Prison. I am part of a team of 50 or so Christian men and women who give their time, prayers, and talents to the incarcerated men, answering Jesus' calling in Matthew 25:40.

I have been blessed in so many ways through serving in Kairos. I have witnessed men give their lives to Jesus...I participated in worship unlike anything I have ever experienced in the free world...and I have been challenged in my beliefs and how God could ever love the unloved.

Kairos has a place for anyone wanting to get involved. These opportunities include witnessing directly with the men inside the prison, preparing meals and agape (tokens of love) to be sent into the prison, and attending a Kairos Closing Ceremony inside the prison and witness directly how Jesus is changing lives and building Christian communities inside of prisons.

Please contact me to further discuss if you feel led to Kairos and are looking to step outside your comfort. This could be your call to enter into Jesus' service working a team with other believers to bring the Good News of the gospel to a mission field hungry for Jesus.
