



Happy New Year Resolution

Surround yourself with friends who share your faith, fostering intentional relationships that encourage spiritual growth.

It's that time when we scratch out 2025 to rewrite the correct year, 2026. Filled with hope of new beginnings and fresh resolutions, we lean into the future while the strains of "Auld Lang Syne" are linger in our minds: ironically, we look forward as we sing about looking back. Robert Burns, the national poet of Scotland, recorded the words in 1788 and published them in 1796. Burns may have simply refined the poem because he was quick to acknowledge an older origin by an unknown writer.

While we know the chorus and the first stanza thanks to Guy Lombardo, it is a much longer song about not forgetting old friends ("auld acquaintances"). Instead, we lift a toast to memories of the old times ("auld lang syne"). If you keep singing the whole tune, Burns writes about the good old days of running across the hills and picking daisies ("We twa hae run about the braes / And pu'd the gowans fine"). Then he expresses regret for how friends drift apart, as the singer has paddled the stream from morning to dinner, but they are separated by broad seas ("We twa hae paidl'd i' the burn / Frae mornin' sun till dine / But seas between us braid hae roar'd"). Finally, Burns writes of reconnecting with each other in the traditional cross-armed Christmas circle dance ("there's a hand, my trusty fiere / And gie's a hand o' thine") and a goodwill toast ("And we'll tak a right guid willy waught").

We may focus on self-improvement and personal goals in the new year, but what really matters are our relationships—first and foremost, our relationship with Jesus. Jesus is the one who unites us at his table "in remembrance of me."

In the Bible, "remember" isn't the opposite of "forget." When a believer cries out, "O Lord, remember me," he isn't lamenting that God has quit thinking about him. Remembering is a call to action, a plea to actively respond based on the covenant bond. As the people were about to enter the Promised Land and face the battles ahead, the Lord reassured them, "Perhaps you will think to yourselves, 'How can we ever conquer these nations that are so much more powerful than we are?' But don't be afraid of them! Just remember what the Lord your God did to Pharaoh and to all the land of Egypt" (Deuteronomy 7:17-18 NLT). In other words, you can trust what God will do because of what God has done; you can be faithful to God and take action because God has always been faithful to you.

Maybe the Lord's Supper should include joining hands, dancing around the communion table, and then lifting the cup of Christ to remember. Having remembered, having a renewed resolve, we can charge forward in confidence, ready to share the good news that Jesus makes all things new (Revelation 21:5), including each of us and our relationships.

This year remember to remember and this indeed be the year of our Lord 2026—a year of love, of reconciliation, of invitation.

We have a great little place where the food and fellowship are always warm and inviting. It is a nice place to sit and visit with old and new friends over a cup of coffee and a plate of pure love.

Mission Café has been “in business” for about 15 years in the Heritage Room and was an idea that Rev. David Henry shared with us after visiting a friend’s church in the Austin area. That church that had a similar program. David’s idea was that we only ask for donations and they should only be used for local missions. Therefore, the name...Mission Café. So, whoever volunteers for a Sunday gets to name the mission project that they want to support with donations made that day.

Each Sunday the volunteers come in early to prepare and offer something warm. We try to have the doors open from 8:00 to 9:45. This enables us to reach members going to and from the 8:30 and 9:00 services and then those heading to Sunday School at 9:45.

Preparation is easy. It is the volunteer’s choice to serve anything they want to. From donuts and pastries, to breakfast tacos, to cooking a full meal of scrambled eggs, grits, biscuits, gravy, and sausage.






New Year Devotional: Rooted for the Year Ahead




