Undershepherd Udderings

During my 37 years as a pastor, I've heard of clergy taking "sabbatical." It is encouraged, based on the biblical model, every seven years. Some sabbaticals range from 30 days to 6 months. Nine years ago, I was grateful to take my first sabbatical, so-called. It came following the custody trial over Jacob, but I also had to promise the Texas Annual Conference that I would do a project. So, I did a 12-part sermon series by shutting myself away from everyone for about 10 days to write a sermon series on the biblical word "Though." I learned that it is not much of a sabbatical if you are working most of the time.

This past year of ministry has been more draining and stressful than any by a country mile. Yet, I was not alone for the Lord was with me, my wife stood by me, and the faithful members of First Methodist Church of Bryan (and our great staff) have buoyed me through it all.

Many have encouraged me to take a sabbatical. I've asked the SPRC for a sabbatical from June 18 - July 17 and I am grateful they granted it. It is very difficult to take 30 days off if you are the only pastor, but thankfully, the Lord has sent Rev. Jeremy Bass and Rev. Augusto Sarria who are able to take care of anything that arises. You can count on our great staff and clergy to handle whatever needs pop up.

I'm a purpose driven person/pastor and I'm grateful for the biblical principles outlined in Rev. Rick Warren's book, *The Purpose Driven Life* (everyone should read it today if you have not read it already). So, I cannot simply take time off without a purpose that will strengthen me in my ministry and provide a stronger, better pastor for the church when I return.

I've written a short purpose statement: To renew my spirit for ministry and seek the Lord in prayer and fasting. My plan is to set aside time each day for prayer and a time during this season to fast. I plan to continue my daily bible reading, but I have set aside some things to read that will feed my soul and focus on improving my prayer life. I'm aided in this quest by a ministry called Soul Shepherding. They have helped thousands of ministers rest and renew through sabbatical. Soul Shepherding is helping me develop a personal plan for sabbatical that will help me achieve my goals (I am purpose-driven after all).

I am grateful for this sabbatical and I realize it is an act of grace on the part of the church to grant it to me. No one earns a sabbatical any more than they earn their salvation. Thank you all for your grace to me and my family. I ask only that you pray for me and our staff every day.



Encountering The Holy Spirit

*Excerpts from "Encounter the Spirit" by Carolyn Moore

"Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, ² fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. ³ Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart." Hebrews 12:1-3

This is the God's recipe for sanctification....in other words "run the race of life so that we can go somewhere spiritually." John Wesley describes the grace of God as a "house" into which we are invited. The porch of the house is **Prevenient Grace**, the grace that calls us to Christ before we know Him. **Justifying Grace** occurs when we step through the doorway, where our sins are forgiven. All the rooms inside the house are designed for **Sanctification** where we learn to love as Christ loves. Sanctification is the process of opening ourselves to the Work of the Holy Spirit, so that we love more and more like Christ does. Sanctification is a continuous process in our lives. Our daily encounters with the Lord through study, prayer and worship will continuingly draw us closer to the Lord. We begin to strive and grow into the work of the Holy Spirit.

Jesus invites his followers to be empowered because it is the power of the Holy Spirit that binds us to Jesus. It is the Holy Spirit who grows us, and it is the Holy Spirit who empowers us for ministry. "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." Acts 1:8

In 1 Corinthians 2 12-16, we learn what it means to be sanctified ¹² What we have received is not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, so that we may understand what God has freely given us. ¹³ This is what we speak, not in words taught us by human wisdom but in words taught by the Spirit, explaining spiritual realities with Spirit-taught words. ¹⁴ The person without the Spirit does not accept the things that come from the Spirit of God but considers them foolishness and cannot understand them because they are discerned only through the Spirit. ¹⁵ The person with the Spirit makes judgments about all things, but such a person is not subject to merely human judgments, ¹⁶ for, "Who has known the mind of the Lord so as to instruct him?" but we have the mind of Christ.
