




Looking Foolish for Jesus

Pentecost is one of my favorite days in the Christian year. To me it is up there with Christmas and Easter. Pentecost, which comes from the Greek word for 'fifty,' is when the Holy Spirit is poured out on those early Christians. The birthday of the Church of Jesus Christ. It is on this day that we begin to see the promises of Jesus fulfilled that we "will do greater things than these because I am going to the Father" John 14:12

When you read the book of Acts you see that it is filled with story after story of normal ordinary people doing incredible things by the power of the Holy Spirit. The early church spoke boldly under persecution (Acts 4, 7), They healed people (Acts 3, 5:12-16), They had visions (Acts 7, 9, 10), They cast out demons (Acts 16, 19) and they did many more things that frankly doesn't look like the American church today.

Peter on the day of Pentecost quotes from the prophet Joel, "In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams" (Acts 2:17). Prophesy, visions, dreams. That's not something we talk a lot about in the church, and yet there it is plainly in Scripture. This promise that is for us of a life that is lived out for God by the power of God for the transformation of the world.

The Spirit of God completely transformed the lives of the early church. Their lives looked different than everyone around them. That's what I want. I want to look foolish for Jesus, to lean deeper into the giftings he's given me and not shy away from the power of the Holy Spirit.

Adult Ministries

During some springtime planting in my yard, my grandkids helped me relocate some oak seedlings. We discussed the importance of the root coming from the acorn and where to move the seedlings. I was reminded of the parable of the Sower and the importance of where WE are planted.

Matthew 13 1-9 (NIV) That same day Jesus went out of the house and sat by the lake. Such large crowds gathered around him that he got into a boat and sat in it, while all the people stood on the shore. Then he told them many things in parables, saying: "A farmer went out to sow his seed. As he was scattering the seed, some fell along the path, and the birds came and ate it up. Some fell on rocky places, where it did not have much soil. It sprang up quickly because the soil was shallow. But when the sun came up, the plants were scorched, and they withered because they had no root. Other seed fell among thorns, which grew up and choked the plants. Still other seed fell on good soil, where it produced a crop—a hundred, sixty or thirty times what was sown. Whoever has ears, let them hear."



Who is the sower? Are we the sowers? It would seem so as we were pointing to the admonition to meditate on God's Word, day and night. Yes, this is true, but we are not the sower. Who is the sower? Jesus is the sower. As he comes to dwell through his Spirit in our inmost being, he sows the Scriptures into our lives, just as the Spirit sowed the Scriptures into his Word made flesh life. We come to Jesus and then Jesus leads us into the Scriptures. And the same Holy Spirit who inspired the Scriptures makes them the means of grace whereby we are transformed into the deep interior likeness of Jesus—leading to the Word of God becoming embodied in our everyday lives. *Excerpts from Seedbed Wake-Up Call by J.D.Walt*
