Four Words from Pastor Jonathan

One word: wow! That's all I can say about how it feels to be your newest pastor. I'm still amazed I get to be a part of what God is doing here in Bryan. That last part—that God works among us and through us—is the most amazing amazement. He doesn't need the best and the brightest; He needs the humble and the faithful. He chooses inconceivable women to be acclaimed moms (Sarah and Mary), shepherds to lead his people (like Moses and David), a farmer to be his prophet (like Amos), fishermen to be his disciples (Peter and Andrew, James and John), and you to be his messenger.

Two words: thank you! Marjorie Lea and I can't sufficiently express our appreciation for the way you have received us with open arms. We already feel at home, that this is right where we belong. That's the church at its best: reaching out to outsiders, welcoming strangers, loving the unknown.

There are nearly 2000 individuals named in the Bible (so I'm told—I didn't count them). They all matter to God. Everybody is somebody. So let's help each other out—especially me. I've got four kids and I don't always get their names right. Marjorie Lea and I are just getting to know you, but it takes a long time. And if we are going to be an inviting church, we will always have new people who need to learn your name.

In conclusion, four words: I look forward to...

Oops, I ran over on my words. I guess you'll have to come find out the rest.



Bank Bill Pay & Mail

Many financial institutions offer online bill pay services, which allow you to set up automatic gifts to the church. Contributions can also be mailed directly. These methods represent a significant portion of the church's monthly gifts and are both fast, simple, and free of fees—for both the donor and the church.

Online via PavPal

While PayPal does charge a small processing fee, the church absorbs this cost so that your full intent is honored. The PayPal option also allows for accepted designated funds or payments of events.

ENDOWMENT SPOTLIGHT

Mrs. Kathryn Esther Ramsey Blackwell was born March 21, 1909, in Denver, Colorado, to Lydia Phoebe Montague Ramsey and the Reverend Preston Taylor Ramsey, a Methodist minister who served in many Texas congregations, including as pastor of Bryan First Methodist Episcopal Church, South from 1918 to 1920. Kathryn excelled in both academics and music, earning Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Music (cum laude) degrees from Southern Methodist University before furthering her studies at Juilliard School of Music. She later taught school in Alvin, Texas, and gave private voice lessons.

While at SMU, Kathryn met the Reverend Derwood Leland Blackwell, himself the son of a Methodist minister. They married in 1934, beginning a lifelong partnership of ministry. Together, Dr. and Mrs. Blackwell served faithfully in Methodist churches throughout Texas. Kathryn joyfully supported her husband's ministry, directing choirs, teaching Sunday school, leading Vacation Bible School, and hosting countless gatherings that fostered fellowship and strengthened faith. Though they had no children of their own, the Blackwells poured their lives into the church and into the communities they served.

In 1974, after decades of full-time ministry, the couple retired to Bryan. For the first time, they settled into a home that was not a Methodist parsonage. Deeply aware of the blessings they had received through Methodism, the Blackwells sought to ensure that their commitment to sharing the gospel would extend far beyond their lifetimes. Out of this desire, they established the Blackwell Lectureship Endowment at First Methodist Church, Bryan.

The purpose of this endowment is to support speakers, events, and programs focused on evangelism—carrying forward the Blackwells' passion for making Christ known. Over the years, the fund has brought to FMC Bryan nationally recognized pastors and authors such as Dr. Morris House and Dr. Chap Clark, as well as powerful musical and theatrical ministries including Foothill Community Ministry, the Skit Guys, and Ken Medema.

Through their vision and generosity, Derwood and Kathryn Blackwell created a legacy that continues to equip the church for evangelism and inspire new generations to proclaim the gospel. Their lives remain a testimony to the joy of serving the Lord and the lasting impact of investing in God's kingdom.

The Men's Retreat planned for October 3-5, 2025 has been postponed until Spring 2026. We will announce the new dates as soon as the planning for Spring concludes.




Office Keepers Needed

A Word for Parents

"Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable—if anything is excellent or praiseworthy—think about such things." – Philippians 4:8

Parenting pre-teens and teenagers in today's world comes with a unique challenge: social media. With constant notifications and endless scrolling, our students are bombarded with voices telling them who to be, how to look, and what to believe.

But Scripture gives us a better focus: to set our minds on what is noble, true, pure, and lovely. As parents, you have the powerful role of modeling and reminding your student to filter what they see online through the lens of God's truth. A few ways to encourage this at home:

Model balance. Show your student what it looks like to take breaks from screens and prioritize real connections.

Ask questions. Instead of just monitoring, invite them to talk about what they're seeing and how it makes them feel.


Point to truth. Remind them daily that their worth and identity are secure in Christ—not in likes, follows, or comments.

Let's walk together in helping our students keep their minds fixed on Jesus, the true source of life and joy.





Young Adult Ministries



The Vine At FMC Bryan, we believe that faith grows best when it's rooted in community. That's why we are excited about The Vine, a Sunday School class designed specifically for young adults (ages 18–25) who are seeking a place to connect, grow, and live out their faith in everyday life. Jesus said in John 15:5, "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing." These words remind us that real life, purpose, and strength come from staying connected to Jesus. Just like branches can't thrive without the vine, we too are called to remain rooted in Christ through worship, study, and fellowship. The Vine is a space where young adults can encourage one another, ask honest questions, and grow deeper together in Christ.

What to Expect

Weekly Bible Study & Discussion – Dig into God's Word and explore how it speaks to the unique challenges of young adulthood. The study for this fall up to Advent is "Invitation" written by Brian D. Russell.

What is the Bible's message? How does it all fit together? In what ways does it speak to women and men hungry for truth in the 21st century?



In *Invitation*, Dr. Brian D. Russell serves as your guide through the narrative of Scripture: Creation, the Fall of Humanity, the Calling of Israel, the Life, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ, the Sending of the Church, and New Creation. Through ten chapters divided into five daily readings, Invitation covers the core content of the Bible with an emphasis on God's mission and the role of God's people in living as a holy community for the sake of the world. The goal of the *Invitation* is not merely information—it seeks the transformation of readers as they encounter the good news of Scripture and realign themselves continually with its powerful truth.

Community & Fellowship – Share life together through conversations, monthly meals together, and fun fellowship events throughout the year.

Spiritual Growth – Learn what it means to bear fruit that reflects God's love in your workplace, school, relationships, and community.

The Vine meets every Sunday morning during the Sunday School hour 10-10:50 AM in Room C211. Come as you are—whether you're in college, starting a career, or finding your way—there's a place for you here.


