Pastor's Corner

In the midst of all the disquieting noise, the babbling opinions, and the idolatry of idle talk, now more than ever, we need to recognize the truth, we need the peace that truth brings, we need the hope truth speaks into our lives. You will not find the truth in the prattle of politicians, pundits, or podcasters. True truth is in God alone.

This fall, our focus is on God's Word.

I know you are thinking, "We're a church. Of course, our attention is on the Bible."

No, I mean we are consciously taking a deep, lingering look at scripture.

It begins with our General Conference in Johannesburg, South Africa. One of the major considerations for the Book of Doctrines and Discipline is the adoption of a new Articles of Faith, outlining our foundational beliefs as the Global Methodist Church. Already, the most discussed article is the wording regarding the Bible: how do we most clearly articulate what it means to have this revelation of the Lord's love and purposes? We want there to be no doubt that our doctrines are founded on the Word of God.

Over the next several weeks, we are preaching a sermon series entitled HIStory. We sing, "I love to tell the story..." We want to take you through the major movements of the Bible as the history—the unfolding story—of God's work of saving us. The sixty-six books written by the pens of about forty authors over a period of about fifteen-hundred years is all one narrative.

To reinforce that, we are leading a study of The Epic of Eden. Dr. Sandra Richter wrote the book that led to the study in which she shows how God original design for Creation is God's ultimate destiny for Creation. Again, it ties the whole Bible together.

Finally, we are organizing the pilgrimage to the Holy Land that will leave the day after Easter next year. Marjorie Lea and I can't wait to introduce you to the places you've only read about in the The Book. You will never read the Bible the same after you go. As a lead-up to the trip, beginning in the new year, we will teach a class about the places we will be visiting. Even if you aren't going, you will learn how the places in scripture are part of the message.

With all of that, I think John Wesley summarizes it best, "I want to know one thing – the way to heaven; how to land safe on that happy shore. God himself has condescended to teach the way: For this very end he came from heaven. He hath written it down in a book. O give me that book! At any price, give me the book of God! I have it: Here is knowledge enough for me. Let me be homo unius libri ("a man of one book")."

Reverend Derwood and Kathryn Blackwell Family Legacy

Rev. Derwood and Kathryn Blackwell firmly believed that evangelism was the church's highest calling. This passion for sharing the Gospel was deeply rooted in their family history—Kathryn's father, Rev. Preston Taylor Ramsey, was equally devoted to evangelism and discipleship, dedicating his ministry to reaching others for Christ.

In 1974, Derwood and Kathryn retired from full-time ministry and chose Bryan as their home. Retirement, however, did not mean stepping away from service. They remained actively involved in Sunday School, Vacation Bible School, and music ministries, continuing to live out their commitment to Christ and His church. Their lives were a testament to the belief that ministry is not confined to a pulpit, but lived out daily through relationships, service, and love.



To honor the legacy and passion for evangelism shared by both the Blackwell and Ramsey families, the Blackwell Evangelism Endowment and the Ramsey Evangelism Endowment were combined in 2018, forming the Blackwell/Ramsey Evangelism Endowment. This unified endowment serves as an enduring resource, ensuring that the work of reaching others for Christ continues for generations to come.

As we enter a new season of school, sports, and extracurricular activities, this legacy challenges and inspires us to be mindful of our witness. Whether on the field, in the classroom, at work, or in our community, we are called to reflect the light and love of Jesus in all that we do.

The Blackwell/Ramsey Evangelism Endowment exists for one specific and powerful purpose—to help us help others and to share the life-changing message of Jesus Christ. Veteran Voices: Celebrating 250 Years as a Nation

LNC(SW), US Navy (Retired), June 1977 – Jan 1998

A 22-year-old man married for two years, my future was uncertain in small town Victoria, Texas. Therefore, a Navy Recruiter convinced me to come aboard in Summer 1977. Our Navy taught me a breadth of skills, professions, leadership challenges and real world education and experience I would have not possibly learned elsewhere. Much of the following I believed I knew in youth, later confirming through my 20-plus years' Naval career in the business of keeping good order and discipline.

Intelligence. You need intelligence to keep freedom, but you don't need intelligence attending our nation's "institutions of higher education". (Later in my Naval career, I often questioned "intelligence" or, questioned if someone erred when the word was placed into the dictionary.)

Management and Leadership. "Institutions of higher education" vainly lecture management and leadership in a class - without practicality and true proper leadership. Those lectured often can't manage leading themselves or others out of a shoebox until experienced. Many cannot fathom, refuse to accept, or exercise a simple concept: you must follow before leading. Failure is often brought by misdirection from those with no management or true leadership experience. There is a reason "Ask the Chief" is a household phrase in and out of the Navy. (Perhaps when this lecture is done, if engaged, you had an education. Perhaps, you may develop an educated opinion.)

Discipline. Self-discipline comes only through self-awareness and intentional actions. You must self-discipline before team discipline.

One must understand what discipline is. Without discipline, you have nothing. Nothing. Discipline is **not** punishment. Punishment is the result of lack of discipline. Discipline is a teaching process. God disciplines us - when there is no discipline, there is punishment. Punishment comes when discipline fails.

With Discipline comes humility, good management, good order, and functional leadership. Planning plus example, plus responsibility equals success. No finger-pointing. We are all leaders, no matter which direction we choose.

Responsibility - Authority. Privileges. They must be inseparable. Don't give responsibility without authority. Don't give authority without responsibility.

Tradition - a privilege. Tradition bonds together those that otherwise have little or nothing in common. The envious seek by design to break the bond through deprivation of tradition.

These are the most important lessons affirmed throughout my Naval career.

My Naval career was blessed with success through the years; through mistakes, hard work, long hours, sacrifice, and extraordinary leadership. Not by right – by exploited privilege. Yes, privilege is a good thing. There was no oppression. No injustice. We credit the privileged before us, those serving with us, and cherish those coming after us. We do not forget where we came from, and we know where we are headed.

Dedicated, honorable, sacrificial service. We do it for the exceptional privileged duty to God and Country; in the same way our rights and privileges are given by our Creator. Love. We do not do it for fame, and we indisputably do not do it for fortune. Our service is not a right. It is a privilege - privilege earned - worked for; to lead by example and keep good order and discipline; to do God's work; to keep the peace, so that our privileges as well as our rights may be kept. Today, we assure you "national security" remains our duty - to eradicate evil, to keep our Country free. I remain The Chief. Once a Chief - always a Chief! For We the People!

Unless we recognize the HUGE difference between right and privilege, we are doomed for failure. I thank our Creator and His People for the honor and privilege of having served. God Bless America Indeed, America is still exceptional.

Back to School • Back to Community • Sent to Shine



A new school year is underway! New schedules, new teachers, new classes, new teams, new friendships; and maybe a little exhaustion as everyone settles back into a routine. As our students head back into classrooms, hallways, locker rooms, band halls, practice fields, lunch tables, jobs, and college campuses, I want to remind them of something important:

You aren't just going back to school. You are being sent.

Every place God has positioned you is an opportunity to reflect Christ. My prayer for our students this year is that they will begin to see their everyday spaces differently; not simply as places they have to go, but as spheres of influence where God can use them.

You don't have to preach a sermon in the hallway to make an impact. Sometimes being the light looks like noticing the student sitting alone. Sometimes it means refusing to participate in gossip. Sometimes it's encouraging a teammate, including someone others overlook, standing up for what is right, or simply being kind when everyone else chooses otherwise.

Parents, we have an incredible opportunity to help our students recognize these moments. Ask them where they see God working. Pray specifically for their friends, teachers, coaches, and classmates. Remind them that following Jesus isn't something they only do at church; it shapes the way they live everywhere they go.

I am excited to begin another year of growing, serving, worshiping, laughing, and doing life together. I can't wait to see what God does through this generation!

Salt & Light: You Are Sent

A Back-to-School Devotional for Students & Families

Jesus tells His followers: **"You are the salt of the earth... You are the light of the world."**
— Matthew 5:13–14

Notice that Jesus doesn't say, *"Someday you might become the light."*

He says, **"You are."**

For our students, school is one of the biggest spheres of influence God has given them. Think about how many people they encounter in one week - classmates, teammates, teachers, coaches, friends, coworkers, and people they barely know. What if we started viewing those encounters as opportunities?

Be Salt - Salt changes whatever it touches.

As followers of Jesus, we should make the places we enter better because Christ is working through us. Being salt might mean:

- Encouraging instead of criticizing
- Including instead of excluding
- Refusing to participate in gossip
- Choosing integrity when no one is watching
- Forgiving when holding a grudge would be easier
- Speaking up when someone is being mistreated

Be Light - Light doesn't have to make noise to change a room. **It simply has to shine.**

Students, you don't have to have all the answers or be the loudest Christian at your school. Let people see Jesus through the way you love, serve, speak, respond, and treat others. Jesus continues: **"Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven."**
— Matthew 5:16

Before walking into school each morning, try praying one simple prayer: **"Jesus, show me where You are**

working today, and help me join You." Then pay attention. Someone may need encouragement. Someone may need a friend. Someone may need to be invited. Someone may simply need to experience the kindness of Jesus through you .

Faithful Parenting

Parents, one of the greatest ways we can disciple our students is by helping them connect their Sunday faith with their Monday life. Instead of only asking: "How was school?" Try asking:

- Where did you see God today?"
- "Who might need some encouragement this week?"
- "Was there a moment today when doing the right thing was hard?"
- "Who can we pray for at your school?"

These questions turn ordinary conversations into discipleship opportunities. Our students don't need parents who have every spiritual answer. They need adults willing to walk beside them, listen well, pray with them, and continually point them toward Jesus.

Family Connection Challenge: The No-Phone 20

Back-to-school schedules can quickly become overwhelming. Between homework, practices, activities, work, church, and everything else, families can spend an entire week together without really connecting. Sometime this week, choose 20 minutes when everyone puts their phones away. Grab dinner, dessert, or a snack and let everyone answer these four questions:

- **HIGH:** What was the best part of your week?
- **LOW:** What was the hardest part?
- **LIGHT:** Where did you see something good or see God at work?
- **SEND:** Who is one person God may be asking you to encourage this week?

Finish by praying for each person's **SEND**. Keep it simple. Twenty minutes. No phones. No perfect answers required. You might be surprised by what you learn about one another.

September Family Prayer

Lord, As our students return to their schools, teams, activities, workplaces, and campuses, help them remember that You go before them. Give them courage to live differently, compassion to notice people who are hurting, wisdom to make good choices, and boldness to stand firm in their faith. Help them be salt where the world needs Your goodness and light where someone needs hope. Give us, as parents and leaders, wisdom to shepherd them well. Help us listen before speaking, pray before worrying, encourage more than criticize, and continually point them toward You. May our homes be places of grace, our churches places of belonging, and our schools places where the light of Christ shines brightly through this generation.

Amen.

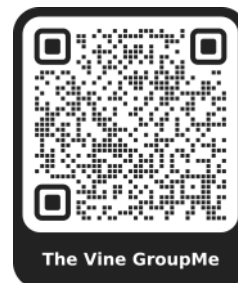
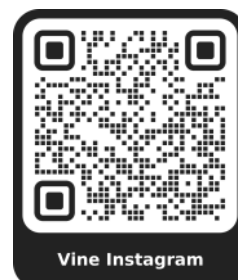
