## A New Year of Open Doors and Open Hearts

January invites us to pause, reflect and begin again. Many of us are coming off a season filled with crowded tables — family gatherings, friends we do not see often enough, and conversations that stretched late into the night. Those moments matter. They remind us that faith is not only practiced in sanctuaries, but around kitchen tables, living rooms, and front porches.

In Acts 2:26, Peter declares, “Therefore my heart is glad and my tongue rejoices; my body also will rest in hope.” This joy was not private or hidden. It was shared life — believers gathering, breaking bread and welcoming others into the story God was writing among them. Joy overflowed because community overflowed.

As we step into a new year, the call remains the same for our students and for us as adults who guide them. We live the gospel when we practice hospitality. That means continuing to show up for friends and relatives, even when schedules get busy again. It also means paying attention to the stranger — the new student, the quiet neighbor, the person who feels unseen.

NextGen ministry is built on this posture. We gather not just to fill a room, but to make space. Space for questions, for laughter, for belonging. My prayer for this year is simple: that our homes, our church, and our lives would be places where glad hearts and rejoicing tongues point others toward the hope we have in Christ.

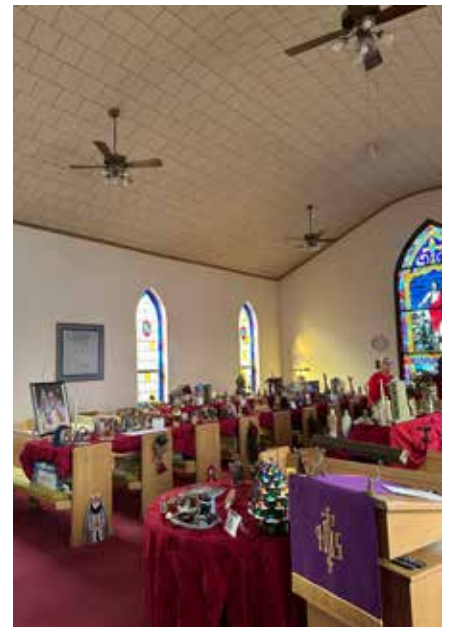

- Country Friends Quilt Group resumes its monthly meetings on Wednesday, Jan. 14.

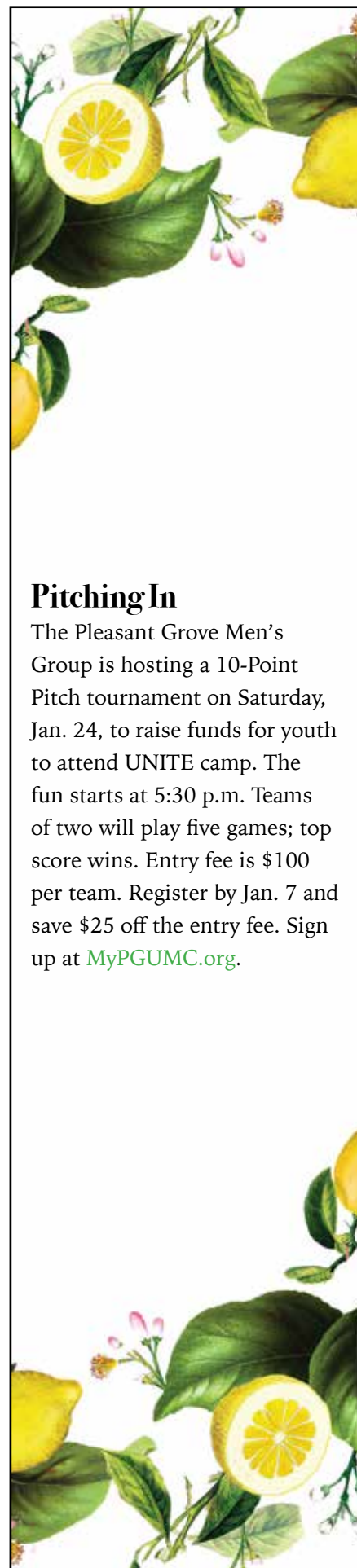
## Extended Break

## 2026 BUDGET SNAPSHOT

The PGUMC Administrative Board has approved a budget for the new year. Here are some highlights for 2026 with comparisons to 2025.

The partnership with Prairie Chapel United Methodist Church is expected to continue in 2026, generating revenue of \$6,000. Salaries and associated benefits remain the church’s largest expense category; there also have been notable increases in the conference apportionment, insurance and utilities. In addition, funds were budgeted for music at the 11 a.m. Sunday service and an intern during the summer months.

# Moving Forward in Mission

A LOOK AT THE 2026 BUDGET

As we look toward the year ahead, it's important to remember who we are and why we do what we do. At Pleasant Grove, our mission is simple and enduring: **to know Jesus Christ and to make Him known**. This mission shapes everything we celebrate, plan and give.

Over the past year, we have witnessed faithfulness and growth. Our children and youth gatherings have increased, and our worship has been vibrant and meaningful. New relationships have formed, old ones strengthened, and lives touched through prayer, service, generosity and presence. These are the results of our congregation's "yes" to God's work among us.

As we prepare for the future, our budget reflects this posture. We assess ministry needs first, trusting God to provide through the generosity of our community. We ask, "What is God calling us to do?" and invite everyone to participate.

## 2026 Budget Snapshot

### What this budget supports:

- **Life-giving worship** that helps us encounter Christ together.
- **Children, youth and family ministries** that form faith across generations.
- **Hospitality and outreach** that extend Christ's welcome into our community.
- **Healthy, supported leadership** for pastors, staff and volunteers
- **Faithful stewardship of our facilities** and shared spaces.
- **Connectional ministry**, including our covenant with Prairie Chapel and the wider United Methodist Church.



### Our approach:

At Pleasant Grove, we discern our ministry needs first and then trust God to provide through the generosity of God's people. This budget reflects growth in ministry and invites continued generosity as we move forward together.

*A full, detailed budget is available upon request or through the church office. A brief summary appears on page 14 of this newsletter.*

This year's budget is focused on growth — both in depth and reach:

- To **know Jesus Christ**, we are investing in thoughtful worship, faith-forming teaching at every life stage, and healthy, equipped leadership.
- To **make Jesus Christ known**, we prioritize hospitality, outreach and connection — within our congregation, with Prairie Chapel, and throughout the community.

Our budget assumes ongoing generosity, rooted in confidence from God's past provisions. Generosity is an expression of discipleship, a way to say, "I believe in what God is doing here, and I want to be part of it."

We are committed to careful stewardship. Past facility expenses have been addressed, and costs are structured responsibly. Our connectional commitments remain a priority, as we believe the church flourishes when we live our faith together.

This budget is a statement of trust — trust in God's calling, provision and the response of Pleasant Grove's people.

As we step into the new year, the invitation is simple: keep going. Show up, give, serve and trust that seeking to know Jesus Christ and make Him known will lead to God's faithfulness.

We are grateful for all that has been and hopeful for what is to come.

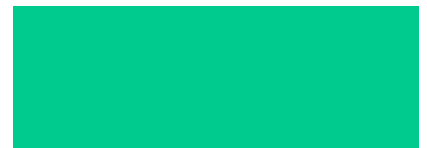

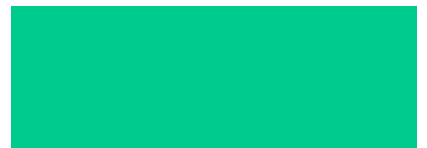

## Bible 101

Ready for a deeper understanding of God's Word? Pastor Paul Klepees will lead a Bible 101 class on Sunday, Jan. 18, from 4 to 6 p.m. at Pleasant Grove. Open to everyone, Bible 101 is a two-hour introduction designed to help participants move beyond a surface reading of Scripture and discover deeper meaning within the biblical text.

The class begins with a clear and accessible overview of the Bible's history and structure, offering helpful tools for understanding how Scripture came together and how it functions as a unified story. Using Psalm 23 as the primary text, participants will practice reading Scripture with attention to context, imagery and theology.
