THE PASTOR'S PEACE

Sent for the Sake of the Gospel

In seasons like this, when change is real and emotions run close to the surface, it's natural to ask why. Why now? Why this move? Why does it have to work this way?

As United Methodists, we are part of a long tradition called itinerancy, a system where pastors are sent to serve where they are needed, not simply where they might choose to stay. At its best, itinerancy is not about moving people around; it's about being faithful to the mission of the Church.

That idea is not new. We see it clearly in the life of the Apostle Paul. In Acts 13, the church gathers in prayer, and the Holy Spirit says, "Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them." And then they laid hands on them and sent them.

Paul's ministry is marked by movement. He goes where the Spirit leads, even when it is difficult, even when it means leaving behind communities he loves. And those communities, in turn, learn to trust that God's work is bigger than any one person or place.

As I shared a few weeks ago, our family has been appointed to serve in Chillicothe. This is not a decision we made lightly. There has been a great deal of prayer, conversation and discernment along the way. We are both excited for what God is calling us into and deeply aware of what we are leaving behind.

This church and this community have shaped us in ways we will carry for the rest of our lives.

That doesn't make it easy.

If we're honest, itinerancy comes with a kind of holy tension. There is gratitude for what has been, grief for what is changing and hope for what God will do next. All of those things can be true at the same time.

But here is what I believe with my whole heart: the same God who called us together is the God who goes with us forward.

The Church has never been built on one pastor. It has always been built on the faithfulness of God and the people who continue the work. And just as Paul entrusted communities into God's care, we trust that God is not finished here, and not finished in what comes next.

So, we walk this road together. With gratitude. With honesty. And with hope.

FILL THE CART

BABY LOVE

Pleasant Grove folks will Fill The Cart in May with diapers, wipes and baby clothes to benefit our Baby Grace ministry, a support program that helps provide basic necessities and resources to families with young children.

Pleasant Grove launched its Baby Grace ministry two years ago. Clients receive diapers, wipes and five clothing outfits each month. New clients also receive a handmade baby quilt from Country Friends Quilt Group or a set of hand-knit baby blanket, hat and slippers made by anonymous donors.

Clothing donations in all sizes are welcome from 3 months to 5T. There is a constant need for diapers in sizes 1 to 7.

When available, Baby Grace also offers gently used high chairs, Pack 'n Plays, walkers, strollers, breast pumps and other provisions (but no car seats as they often are outdated). Expectant mothers can join Baby Grace when they begin their third trimester. Supplies are distributed to eligible families on the third Thursday of every month, from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. in the church basement.

A Message from Pastor Paul



Dear Pleasant Grove Family,
Grace and peace to you.

After much prayer, discernment, and conversation between my family, the Bishop, the Cabinet, and myself, I want to share with you that my appointment as senior pastor of Pleasant Grove United Methodist Church will come to an end this summer. My final Sunday with you will be June 14, with the appointment officially concluding on June 30. In July, Bishop Bob Farr will be appointing our family to the service of Jesus Christ in another community.

Over the past nine years, we have seen God do something special among us. Together, we have grown into a vibrant church family that cares deeply for one another and for our community. It has been a joy and a privilege to walk alongside you in this season of ministry.

I am especially grateful for the ways we have watched our children and youth not only grow in number, but grow in their love for Jesus. I am thankful for the partnerships we have built in our community to serve others in meaningful ways. And I give thanks for the way discipleship has taken root across all ages, as people have sought to know Christ more deeply and share that love with others.

Through prayer and discernment, it has become clear that this season of my ministry here has come to its natural conclusion. In the United Methodist tradition, we trust that God works through the process of appointment, and I believe this next step is part of God's continued leading for both Pleasant Grove and for me.

Pleasant Grove is a faithful and strong church. You love God, and you love people deeply. You have a heart for seeing new lives in Christ and for teaching the next generation to follow Jesus. You are not a fragile church on the brink of decline.

You are a church with a vibrant future. I have full confidence that God will continue to lead and bless this congregation in the days ahead.

A new pastor will be announced in the coming weeks. I encourage you to trust the process and trust God's timing. Most importantly, I ask that you surround this transition with prayer: for the church, for your next pastor, and for one another.

On a personal note, Pleasant Grove has been home for our family. It is the only home three of our children have ever known. This is where I began my first full-time appointment, where I continued my education in seminary, and where I became an elder in the United Methodist Church. You have been more than a church to us, you have been our friends and our family. This place will always hold a special place in our hearts.

What I will miss most is you, the people of Pleasant Grove. I am deeply proud of the way you have continually looked for opportunities to grow in your faith and to help others come to know Jesus. The dreams we have talked about for the future of this church are still ahead, and they will be realized ... just under different leadership. And that is okay. God is not finished with Pleasant Grove.

As we move through these final weeks together, I look forward to continuing in ministry with you, worshiping, serving and giving thanks for all that God has done and all that God will yet do.
