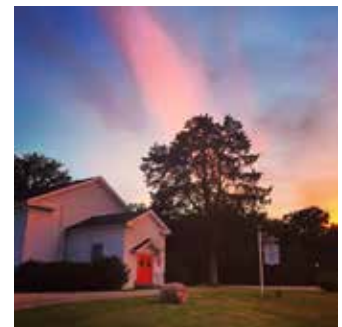

Walking in Faith, Not Fear

October is here — the season of crisp air, colorful leaves, and yes, a little spooky fun. Ghost stories and haunted houses remind us how easily fear can sneak up on us. But as followers of Christ, we're invited to a different kind of adventure: walking in faith, not fear.

Scripture reminds us, "For God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power and of love and of a sound mind." (2 Timothy 1:7) Fear may be thrilling in a haunted hayride, but in life, it can paralyze us. Faith, on the other hand, anchors us in God's promises and steadies our steps even when the path ahead feels uncertain.

Think of the heroes of Scripture — Abraham stepping into the unknown, Moses facing Pharaoh, Peter stepping out of the boat to meet Jesus. Their courage reminds us that following God often asks us to move forward even when it's a little scary. "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to him, and he will make your paths straight." (Proverbs 3:5-6)

Faith is active, not passive. It shows up in small, daily decisions: trusting God with your worries, choosing love over anger, and stepping into opportunities for service. When fear creeps in — like a shadow in a dark hallway — we are called to look to Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, and take the next step with courage.

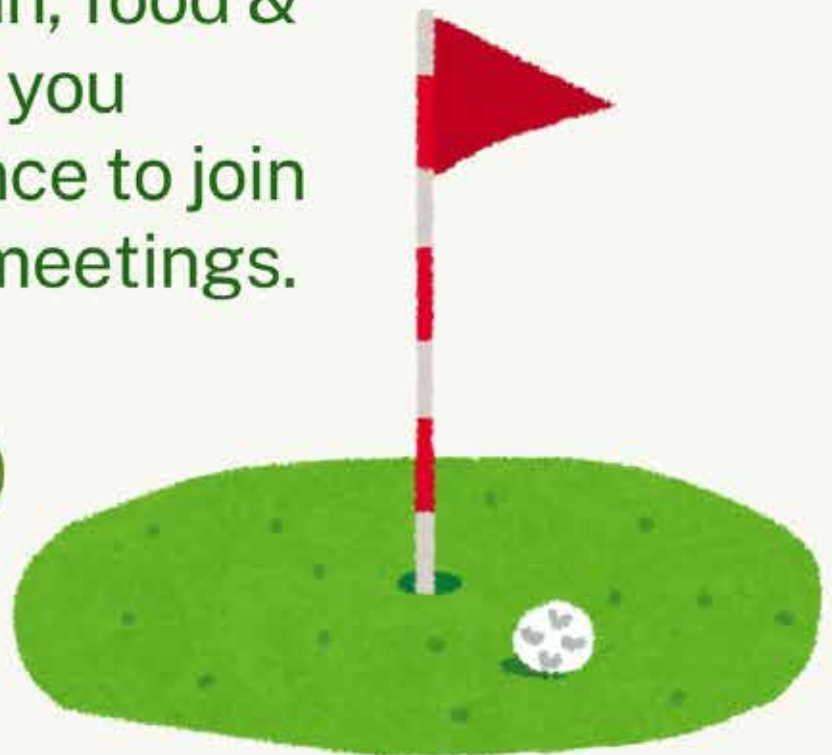

Threads of Care

Faith Lives in Works of Mercy

Within the last year, I have learned to make a lot of chunky-knit blankets. I calculated the amount of yarn it takes for a blanket, gathered the materials needed to piece it together, and made time to do it! So, if I had all the materials I needed but didn't actually use my hands to knit the blanket, would that make a good blanket? No! It would be like having all the ingredients to make dinner but not actually cooking. Faith is quite similar. It's a very personal journey that shouldn't be kept personal; it's supposed to be shared with others! Becoming a follower of Jesus is something you can work at to enhance, to strengthen, to mend or to shape, but what do we do when our faith is strong and ready for the world? We put our faith into work!

John Wesley, the founder of Methodism, often spoke of "works of mercy"—feeding the hungry, visiting the sick, clothing the naked, comforting the grieving. He believed these were not optional extras to our faith, but vital ways of living it out. In serving our neighbors, we serve Christ himself (Matthew 25:40). When we know better, we do better (or, at least, we try). Knowing that God loves everyone around us and that God loves us is foundational to serving God through serving other people.

This month, let's ask ourselves: Where is God calling me to put my faith into action? It may be something small — a kind word, a shared meal, a helping hand — or it may be something larger, like joining a ministry of mercy. Whatever the step, it is through these works of love that faith comes alive and shines the light of Christ into the world.

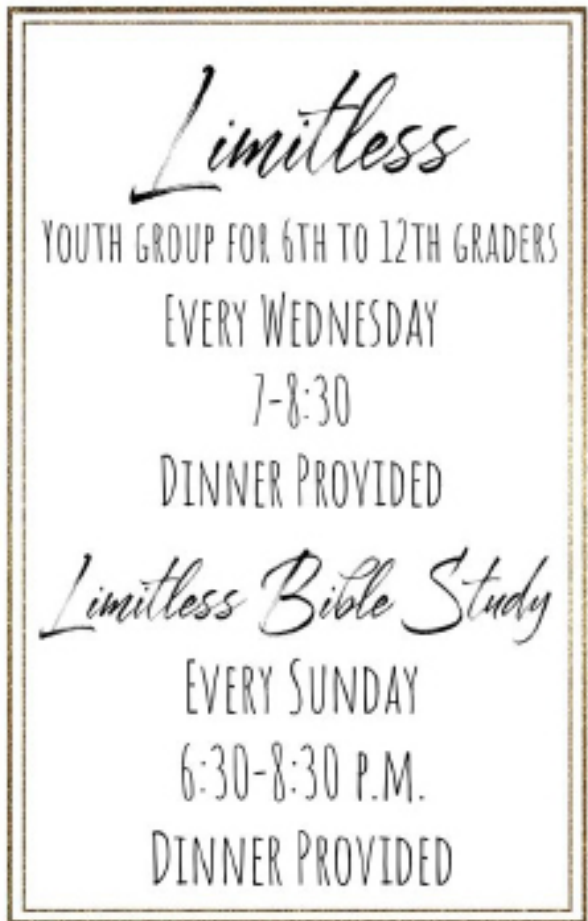

Ask, Seek, Knock: Prayer Changes Us

In Luke 17 and 18, Jesus teaches His disciples about faith, perseverance and prayer. In chapter 17, He reminds us that even faith the size of a mustard seed can do great things. Then in chapter 18, He tells the parable of the persistent widow who never gave up asking the judge for justice. Jesus ends the story by asking, "When the Son of Man comes, will He find faith on the earth?"

Prayer isn't just about saying the right words. It's about trusting that God hears us, even when the answer doesn't come right away, or is hard to understand, or is not what we expected it to be. Sometimes prayer feels like planting seeds — we don't see the results immediately, but something is happening beneath the surface. Our students face challenges every day — tests, friendships, sports, decisions about their future. It can feel overwhelming. But Jesus invites us to bring it all to Him in prayer.

Pray boldly, like the widow who refused to give up. Pray faithfully, like the disciples were challenged to do. And pray with the confidence that God is listening and working for your good. Here's the truth: prayer changes us as much as it changes our circumstances. It builds our faith, shapes our character and reminds us that we are never alone. So, this month, set aside time to talk with God honestly. Ask, seek, knock — and trust that He is faithful.

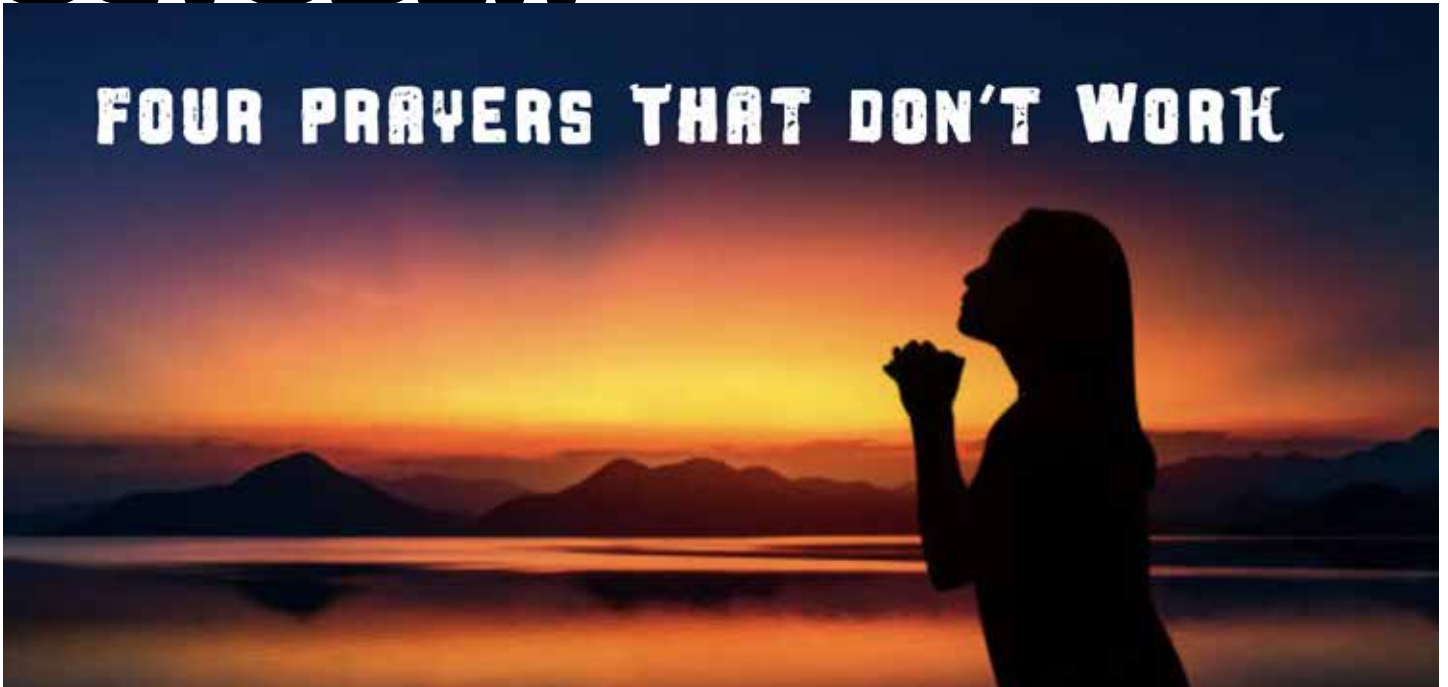

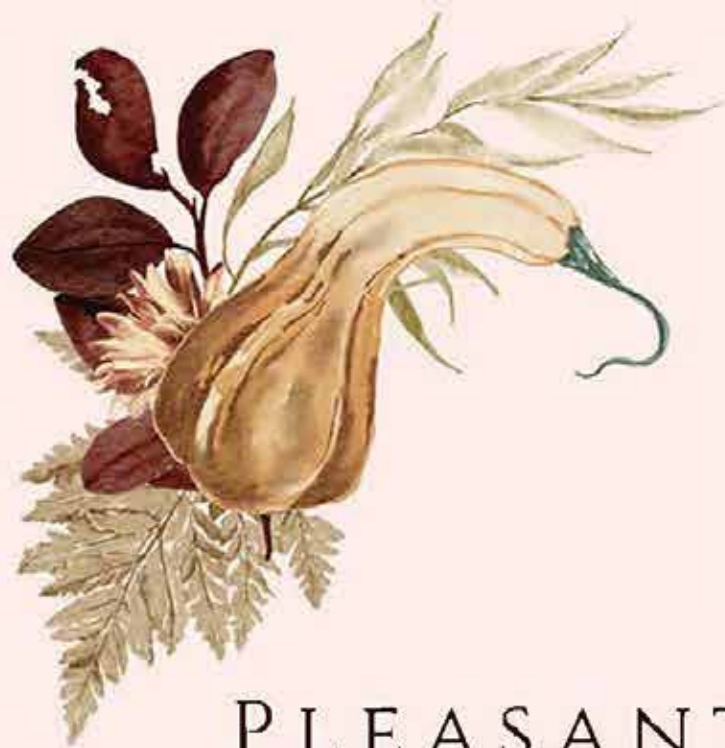
