#2 What Happens Immediately After Death (& *How Do We Know*)? 2 Corinthians 5:1-8

Scientific, philosophical, and theological skepticism has nullified the modern belief in heaven and replaced it with teachings that are minimalist, meager, and dry. ... When a Christian dies, is he then in an unconscious state awaiting the resurrection? Or does he have a conscious existence living in heaven in an intermediate state between death and the resurrection? and how do we know?

The traditional view that our souls are separable from our bodies has been challenged by many scholars, including evangelicals. ... I believe that one must have sufficient reason for denying or completely revising what the historic Christian church has affirmed as the teaching of Scripture and proclaimed to comfort millions of people who have mourned at gravesides.

The Intermediate State = refers to the existence of a believer between death and the resurrection.

Soul Sleep = when believers die they go into a state of unconscious existence; the next thing that they are conscious of will be when Christ returns and raises them to eternal life.

Materialism = that man is totally a material being. This is sometimes referred to as monism.

Don't confuse these two terms:

Monotheism teaches that there is One God

Monism teaches that there is only one reality or thing or substance

Christian dualism is the belief that human beings possess both body and soul/spirit and that when the body dies the soul/spirit continues to exist in a conscious state until the resurrection and the reception of a resurrection body.

Alvin Plantinga "it seems to me to be perfectly conceivable that I can exist when my body doesn't."

What enters into the debate once again is one's view or take on the Bible. One's real view, not the one they spout when in church. Does it really affect, guide and direct their thinking....

Many people (this includes some Christians) believe that what science cannot observe and substantiate does not exist.

The *Westminster Confession of 1646* and the *London Baptist Confession 1689* hold to the traditional view of Protestant orthodoxy and a dualist anthropology regarding the intermediate state.

The Confession reads: The bodies of men, after death, return to dust, and see corruption: but their souls, which neither die nor sleep, having an immortal subsistence, immediately return to God who gave them: the souls of the righteous, being then made perfect in holiness, are received into the highest heavens . . . waiting for the full redemption of their bodies. and the souls of the wicked are cast in to hell. . . At the last day, such as are found alive shall not die, but be changed: and . . . the dead [believers] shall be raised up, with the selfsame bodies, and none other (although with different qualities), which shall be united again to their souls forever.

Matthew 10:28-32

So talk of killing ‘the body’ already implies that there is more to a person than the body.

‘Body’ and ‘soul’ point to a fundamental dualism in human beings. In this life, of course, body and soul are closely united, and God will eventually reunite them in the resurrection body. But Scripture consistently teaches that the two are separated at death.

(Luke 23:43 and Philippians 1:23-24)

Dualism recognizes both nonmaterial and material aspects of human beings. Dualism is what is assumed and communicated in the Scripture: that man is two things, both body and soul.

If you don’t believe this then you believe that man is one thing, that he is not body and soul, but that the physical and mental cannot be divided. Then you also believe that at death the person—the whole person—is dead, ceases to exist, and that person—the one you know—will never exist as the same person again.

Important Musical Archaeological Find

In 1918, in an ancient city of Egypt, called Oxyrhynchus, a papyrus fragment was discovered, which later turned out to be invaluable, for on the back of it was written a music piece with Greek letter notation, which is the hymn to the Holy Trinity, thus known to be Oxyrhynchus Hymn, the *oldest known music notation and lyrics of a Christian hymn* (believed to have been written in the late 200's).

Meditation in the Midst of Madness: (Psalm 96:10-12)

Oh lovers of Yahweh! Detest evil!

He is the preserver of the souls of His godly ones.

He delivers from the hand of the wicked.

Light is shed abroad for the righteous.

And for the pure of heart there is joy.

Oh righteous ones, rejoice in Yahweh!

Confess (give thanks for) the memory of His holiness!

I had to begin with this text for my own sanity. You have Vimeo shutting down explicitly Christian voices that dare to defy the new dogma of the Totalitarians. You have the madness, insanity, twistedness of trans-mania flowing like a flood across the land, being forced into the minds of children by willing “educators” (i.e., indoctrinators). You literally have the degradation of the English language, so that we are being told we MUST bow down and say absurd things like “they is leaving now” or “Zir is here”. Is the God of Christianity the Same as the God of Islam?

Imagine the following scenario: two people claim to know the same professional football player. The football player's name is Alex and he plays in the NFL. The first person who knows Alex the football player describes him this way:

He is 6' 6" tall, he weighs 305 lbs., he plays left tackle, he is married, and he plays for the Carolina Panthers.

Now the second person describes Alex the football player:

He is 6' 2" tall, he weighs 256 lbs., he plays middle linebacker, he is single, and he plays for the Atlanta Falcons.

When we started out, we were pretty confident that these two people were talking about the same Alex the football player. Once we asked for more details, though, we quickly discovered that they are not the same person at all, but two different people. We just needed a little more information about Alex from each person.

This is the same situation with the God of Islam and the God of Christianity. Both are claimed to be the God of Abraham and both are monotheistic creator-God's. If we stop there, we might conclude that they must be the same God.

Unfortunately, there is a slight problem. Christians believe that God is three persons in one nature, a Trinity. The three persons are the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Muslims flatly reject the Trinity. There is only one person who is God, not three.

Second, Christians believe that Jesus Christ is the God-man – he is fully God and fully man. Muslims completely reject this idea of Jesus as God-man. They view Jesus as a mere human prophet who is less important than the final prophet, Muhammad.

There are more differences in the God of Islam and the God of Christianity, but we need go no further. Just based on the differences highlighted above, we are 100% sure that these two Gods are not the same.

One final note. We must admit that there are some similarities in the God of Islam and the God of Christianity, and when Christians speak to Muslims about God, we can use these similarities as launching pads to share our faith. However, just because there are some similarities, we must not fall into the trap of papering over the very real and very significant differences. Closing our eyes to the key beliefs of these two religions doesn't get us anywhere.

The Cross and the Falsification of Islam

Sura 4:156-159 states:

“Allah set a seal upon them owing to their unbelief, so they shall not believe except a few. And for their unbelief and for their having uttered against Marium a grievous calumny. And their saying: Surely we have killed the Messiah, Isa son of Marium, the apostle of Allah; and they did not kill him nor did they crucify him, but it appeared to them so (like Isa) and most surely those who differ therein are only in a doubt about it; they have no knowledge respecting it, but only follow a conjecture, and they killed him not for sure. Nay! Allah took him up to Himself; and Allah is Mighty, Wise. and there is not one of the followers of the Book but most certainly believes in this before his death, and on the day of resurrection he (Isa) shall be a witness against them.”

The Quran claims that Jesus was not killed. It denies the death of Jesus on the cross of Calvary.

The Crucifixion of Jesus attested by both biblical and extra-biblical evidences.

Biblical Evidence: Eye-witnesses record

- Sleepless night of trial in three places – High Priest to Pilate to Herod and Back to Pilate.
- After being ordered to be executed Jesus was ‘scourged’ by Romans and exhausted by being sent to various places.
- Carries the Cross to Golgotha – Unable – helped by Simon of Cyrene.
- Crucified between two criminals – Crucifixion – Difficulty to breathing – Break legs – cannot breath
- Submits his Spirit to God – Breathes his last
- Centurion finds he is dead –No respiration – so does not break his bones – Spear thrust into the sides– Water and blood gush out
- Pilate asks to check if he is dead before handing over to Joseph of Arimathea. Ref:Mark 15:45
- Death doubly confirmed in eye witness testimony in the Gospel narratives
- Earliest Traditions in the NT contained in 1 Corinthians 15, date back to early part of the third decade of the first century.

3 For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, 4 and that He was buried, and that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, 5 and that He appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. 6 After that He appeared to more than five hundred brethren at one time, most of whom remain until now, but some have fallen asleep; 7 then He appeared to James, then to all the apostles (1 Corinthians 15:3-7)

Skeptical Scholar John Dominic Crossan says that the death of Jesus “is as sure as anything historical can ever be.”

2. Scientific Proof - “Jesus of Nazareth underwent Jewish and Roman trials, was flogged, and was sentenced to death by crucifixion. The scourging produced deep stripe like lacerations and appreciable blood loss, and it probably set the stage for

hypovolemic shock, as evidenced by the fact that Jesus was too weakened to carry the crossbar (patibulum) to Golgotha. At the site of crucifixion, his wrists were nailed to the patibulum and, after the patibulum was lifted onto the upright post (stipes), his feet were nailed to the stipes. The major pathophysiologic effect of crucifixion was an interference with normal respirations. Accordingly, death resulted primarily from hypovolemic shock and exhaustion asphyxia. Jesus' death was ensured by the thrust of a soldier's spear into his side. Modern medical interpretation of the historical evidence indicates that Jesus was dead when taken down from the cross." — Journal of the American Medical Association (JAMA 1986;255:1455-1463)

3. Extra-biblical Evidence - "All human efforts . . . of the emperor, and the propitiations of the gods, did not banish the sinister belief that the conflagration was the result of an order. Consequently, to get rid of the report, Nero fastened the guilt and inflicted the most exquisite tortures on a class hated for their abominations, called Christians by the populace. Christus, from whom the name had its origin, suffered the extreme penalty during the reign of Tiberius at the hands of one of our procurators, Pontius Pilatus, and a most mischievous superstition, thus checked for the moment, again broke out not only in Judea, the first source of the evil, but even in Rome, where all things hideous and shameful from every part of the world find their center and become popular." – Tacitus

"after him whom they still worship—the man who was crucified in Palestine for introducing this new cult into the world" – Lucian of Samosata

"In the third book of his Histories, Thallus calls this darkness a solar eclipse. In my opinion, this is nonsense because Jesus died at the time of a full moon, which necessitates a "wonderful sign," or miracle, instead." – Julius Africanus .

"What advantage did the Jews gain by executing their wise King? It was just after that that their kingdom was abolished" – Mara bar Serapion

"And when Pilate, at the suggestion of the principal men among us, had condemned him to the cross, those that loved him at the first did not forsake him;" – Josephus, Jewish Historian

"On (Sabbath eve and) the eve of Passover Jesus the Nazarene was hanged. And a herald went forth before him 40 days (heralding):

Jesus the Nazarene is going forth to be stoned because he practiced sorcery and instigated and seduced Israel (to idolatry). Whoever knows anything in his defense, may come and state it. But since they did not find anything in his defense, they hanged him on (Sabbath eve and) the eve of Passover." – Babylonian Talmud

Conclusion - The Quran claims to be the perfect inerrant revelation of God. The Quran denies the death of Christ. History confirms the death of Christ. Therefore Quran is not inerrant; Quran is not the revelation of God. So Mohammed the messenger who delivered the message in the Quran and claimed to be a prophet from God is a False Prophet and Islam which claims to be the true way is proved to be false religion. Thus the death of Christ on the Cross falsifies the Quran and proves that Mohammed is a false prophet and disproves Islam as false cult.
