Secret Church: This Year's Topic

The apostle Paul was astonished that some followers of Christ in his day were "turning to a different gospel," and he pleaded with them not to be deceived by those who wanted to "distort the gospel of Christ." These warnings given to the church in the first century are just as relevant today for the church in the twenty-first century.

For the good of our souls and for the sake of the church's mission, followers of Christ need to ask, "What false gospels are being taught today?" and "How can I recognize the true gospel among so many counterfeits?" Answering these questions will be the aim of Secret Church 18, "Cults and Counterfeit Gospels."

We will consider the claims of Jehovah's Witnesses, Mormons, and other groups that claim to teach the truth. We will also explore more subtle distortions of the gospel, including prosperity teaching that is rampant across the church. In the end, our goal is to walk away from this Secret Church not only enabled to discern false gospels, but also equipped to share the true gospel with people around us and with peoples around the world.

Leadership Additions for Prayer

At our next congregational meeting on **April 15**, the church will be making a very important decision regarding hiring Tom Keller to serve as a minister to senior adults at Ferguson Avenue Baptist Church. Tom has been attending our Sunday Morning services with his family for several months now. He has attended an outing with our senior adults and he preached the message at our Christmas banquet. Tom studied theology at Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary, he has experience serving senior saints, and he continues to conduct services for seniors every Sunday morning at Savannah Commons. In order to provide the church another opportunity to hear Tom preach, Tom will be conducting the Sunday morning service on Sunday, April 8. If the church votes to accept the deacons' recommendation to hire Tom, he will be hired on a part-time basis for a period of 120 days, after which his position will become full time unless he or the church have significant reason not to proceed with that arrangement.

As a minister to senior adults, Tom's responsibilities would include the following:

- Creating and executing a long-term vision for seniors' ministry.
- Leading and organizing effective programs implementing worship, biblical teaching, discipleship, and evangelism, as well as plan events of interest to senior adults.
- Recruiting, training and discipling volunteer staff with diverse gifts and personalities that would minister through visitation, greeting cards, telephone calls, meals, transportation, etc.
- Providing counseling and spiritual direction to seniors on an individual basis.
- Maintaining contact with the seniors, keeping them informed of ongoing activities.
- Contacting appropriate persons or groups to encourage their response to those in need, assisting in the development and oversight of the seniors' ministry budget, and managing seniors' fees (if any) for events and trips.
- Participate as needed or requested in the evaluation and development of the overall church ministry.

While the pastors want the congregation to be free to vote your conscience in the upcoming congregational meeting, we are convinced that this move will be good for the continued development of our church. Therefore, we ask that if you have any hesitation in affirming Tom to this position of leadership, we would ask that you address your concerns with the pastors or with Tom prior to the congregational meeting.

We would also like the church to be aware that we are carefully moving through the process of examining Steve Posner for the position of elder. This is new, albeit exciting territory for the church, and so we ask for your grace and patience as we attempt to navigate these new waters. Steve was nominated for the position of elder at the end of 2017, and has already undergone a time of questioning by the deacons. Steve has been teaching at the church for several years and has had ample opportunity to demonstrate his character, his love for God's word, and his love for the church. If Steve is elected to the position of elder, he will provide added accountability, insight, and leadership alongside those already serving as pastors. As a church, we have been preparing to make this move for many years, and the opportunity is now here to bring ourselves into greater conformity with the biblical model of church leadership. We would likewise ask that if you have any hesitation about Steve serving the church in this capacity, that you make those concerns known to the pastors or to Steve so that when the time comes the church can in good conscience affirm Steve to the position of elder.

We look forward to serving with these men for the good of the church and for the advance of the kingdom of Christ.

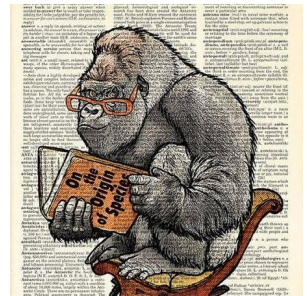

This One Commitment Will Keep Your Marriage Together

Can you keep your marriage together?

For those who come to marriage counseling, the majority of the time, this answer is, “Yes.” This is true for most couples where one or both spouses are willing to put in some work. In the country, we call it *sweat equity*. Hard work goes a long way to keep a marriage together. It may not be easy, but, for the majority of marriages, it is possible.

However, there is *one* commitment you can make that will guarantee you keep your marriage together.

You may be thinking, “Kevin, that’s a bold statement.” Yes, it is. But if you *both* make this one commitment, your marriage will not fail. At this point you are asking, “So what is it?”

Here it is: you both commit to the Bible being the final authority in your life, and, subsequently, your marriage.

How will this guarantee your marriage will not fail?

- **Sin. Marriage is the union by covenant of two sinners.** Two individuals that are in the midst of life’s greatest challenge: living together as one in the middle of the process of sanctification for the glory of God. The Bible gives clear direction on how to respond to sin, how to seek and grant forgiveness, how to identify and correct sin, and how to protect from future sin.
- **Struggle and suffering. Life is difficult.** All couples go through seasons of suffering and struggle. Life is not easy generally, and, at times, is just hard. The difficulties stem from various hurts to financial trouble, demanding schedules to vocational pressures, and raising children to health challenges. Thankfully, the Bible deals with all these issues as well.
- **Love. The Bible teaches the standards for love, the endurance of love, and the benefits of true love.** Of course, all of this revolves around knowing the Christ of the Bible and His love, which is faithful, sacrificial, and motivating.
- **Preferences.** Do you ever have an opinion? Do you think married couples occasionally have differing opinions? Of course, they do. The Bible provides the wisdom needed to navigate the differences in preferences best.
- **Conflict. Every marriage, like every relationship, has conflict.** The Bible

provides specific steps forward for the couple who depends upon it as their authoritative guide. The road through conflict may be dicey; however, the Word of God sheds light on the path toward resolution.

- **Decision making.** Are there one, two, thirty, or fifty decisions per day in marriage? In this process, when the Bible is the authority for decision making, the married couple can determine a way forward according to God's standards, godly wisdom, and personal choice.
- **Purpose of life and marriage.** The Bible helps both the husband and wife understand the biggest issues in life like: Why are we here? What are we living for? What's most important for our family and our marriage? What should be our priorities in life? These and many other questions are answered in the Bible providing help for the married couple to live together in unity.
- **Christ and the church.** The relationship between Christ and the church forms the foundation for the relationship between the husband and wife. With all the competing interests that vie for attention in marriage, the Bible strengthens the couple committed to the authority of Scripture.
- **Christ and the Gospel. Life is Christ. Couples who learn, love, and live Christ with a sensitivity toward the Gospel make it.** This intimate relationship with Christ that produces spiritual fruit and wisdom emanates from keeping the Word of God primary. In its pages, the couple learns Christ and grows in wisdom.

Do you want to guarantee the long-term strength and viability of your marriage? Then make the commitment today that the Bible will be your final authority for living. This one commitment keeps the rest of your life in check. When tempted to give up, throw in the towel, and lose hope, the Word of God through the power of the Spirit gives you the ability to persevere.

Marriage may never be easy, depending on how you define easy; however, marriage is sustainable for the glory of God, the good for each spouse, and the benefit of others. ❖

Hollywood, Capitol Hill and the Human Heart

As more women bring to light the heinous sexual misconduct of male celebrities and politicians, it would do us good to remember two all-important truths: **First**, God's word testifies to the pervasive depravity of all men and women (Rom. 3:10-18); and, **second**, Scripture holds out the universal remedy for sinful men and women--namely, Christ and him crucified. To make this observation is in no way whatsoever to downplay the urgent need we have to protect women from sexual predators and to put puni-

tive measures in place to prevent sexual harassment and abuse of all shapes and forms. It is, however, to highlight that there are dangers associated with the media's fixation on only one or two forms of sexual sin, while neglecting the biblical testimony about the pervasive spiritual depravity of men and women. When depravity is denied, the Gospel is inevitably neglected or rejected. When the Gospel is neglected or rejected, there can be no prospect of forgiveness, cleansing, restoration and renewal--the hope of which Scripture constantly holds forth while bringing indictments against the sin of mankind.

We ought to welcome an exposure of sexual sin in a culture that has celebrated, embraced and fought for every other conceivable form of sexual sin. However, only highlighting one or two specific forms of sexual depravity will have the inevitable and undesired result of fueling self-righteousness among those outraged by it. When the media singles out one particular sexual sin, while approving almost all other forms, one who hasn't fallen into a socially unacceptable form of sexual sin begins to go on a self-righteous rampage about the sin of others while refusing to acknowledge his or her own depravity.

There is no outrage in the media about the absolutely hellish nature of pornography and the destructive nature it has on marriages, young people and on society as a whole. As our culture rejects the clear teaching of Scripture, and increasingly promotes and defends polyamorous, incestuous and every conceivable form of androgynous and homoerotic act, we are sliding into a veritable pit of sexual depravity. The media would have us believe that the great problem in Hollywood and Capitol Hill is the problem of power structures that allow men to abuse that power in order to gratify sexual desire. The news outlets may shine an occasional spotlight on the female teacher who engaged in inappropriate sexual relations with an underage student; but, it is men in positions of power that are the chief perpetrators. Nevertheless, it is not power structures that lead male politicians and celebrities or female teachers into sexually depraved acts. If we only focus on nurture, to the neglect of nature, we will ultimately bring about nothing lasting.

The Scriptures are clear that the problem in Hollywood and Capitol Hill is the problem of the human heart. We are all fallen in Adam (Rom. 5:12-21). The guilt and corruption of Adam's sin was imputed to all of his descendants. There is no other explanation for why Bill Clinton, Donald Trump, Anthony Weiner, Bill Cosby, Kevin Spacey, Roy Moore and Al Franken have done the repulsive things they have done. There is no other explanation for why you and I have done all of the sinful things that we have done.

When the Apostle Paul set forth the Bible's exposure of our depravity, he explained: "the Scripture imprisoned everyone under sin, so that the promise by faith in Jesus Christ might be given to those who believe" (Gal. 3:22). The Scripture exposes sin and confines all men and women under sin's dominion and condemnation so that those who will believe on Christ will come to him for forgiveness and redemption. If all we do is agree with the secular world about the heinousness of one or two forms of sexual sin, and throw our support to the call for accountability and repercussions, we are simply wielding God's Law. However, when we acknowledge the testimony of Scripture about our own pervasive depravity and our need for Christ, we will be all the more ready to extend the hope of forgiveness and cleansing in Christ to those whose depravity has been publicly exposed. This is an opportunity for the church to speak to the culture at a time when the culture is still acknowledging certain forms of sin and depravity. The window may be small, and the moment is passing by quickly; but, if we have eyes to see and hearts that are burdened for the lost, we will seek to seize the moment for the redemption of both men and women around us. ❖

Missionary of the Week

Ray & Marti Williams TEAM - NAMA

The Williams worked in Adelaide, South Australia, for many years to help Australian Churches develop and implement church planting strategies, emphasizing leadership training and development. They taught at Adelaide College of Ministries, which recently merged with the Bible College of South Australia. They also were involved in other areas of ministry in local churches. Their final visa appeal was denied, and they are settling into life and ministry, still with TEAM, working with the North American Ministry Area, here in the United States, specifically South Carolina. Marti will be working in an effort to expand the ministry of women and other under-represented people groups in biblical leadership roles within TEAM and beyond.
