7 Reasons to Thank God for Unanswered Prayer

Do you know what it's like to continually wait on God for an answer to your prayer? Maybe someone you minister to is struggling with the fact that they've been praying and God hasn't been answering.

I'm a firm believer that God knows exactly what He's doing when He says "no" to our prayers, when He seems to wait before answering our prayers, or when it seems He isn't listening at all.

Psalm 145:8-9 says: The Lord is gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and rich in love. The Lord is good to all; he has compassion on all he has made.

That tells me that His graciousness, compassion, and love are at work – even in unanswered prayer. So here are seven reasons to thank God even when you're not getting an answer – yet:

- 1. God may be waiting to give you something even better than you requested. In First Samuel chapter 1, we discover that Hannah wanted a baby. But God wanted to give her so much more than just a child. While Hannah was watching the clock (wondering for years why God wasn't opening her womb), God was watching a country, waiting for the precise time to allow Hannah to conceive a child she would name Samuel who would become one of Israel's greatest prophets and priests. Hannah just wanted to be a mom but God wanted so much more for Hannah's life and He ended up giving her not only several children, but a legacy as well (First Samuel 1-3). Thank God that His unanswered prayers often mean He is holding out for your best.
- 2. God's "no" in this situation may be for your or someone else's protection. I know many women who are very discouraged that God hasn't let them marry, or let them marry again. "Why won't He bring me a husband?" they keep asking. I can't answer that. But I know God is good. I know He sees their entire story. And I know He cannot act apart from His goodness. That often leads me to believe that He sees something down the road that we don't. And if we are praying for His will and His best for our lives, we can be confident that His withholding or His silence is because He is protecting us from something we don't and might not ever see. Can you trust Him with that? Thank Him that He cares about you that much.
- 3. By not giving you what you want, as soon as you ask for it, God is ensuring that you will keep coming back to ask. God won't settle for the role of Santa Claus in your life. He wants a relationship, one in which you commune with Him, share with Him the struggles on your heart, and keep the communication going. God knows if we got what we wanted as soon as we asked, we'd take it and leave Him in the dust. Trust the process. And thank Him for desiring your communication, your trust, and a personal relationship with you.
- 4. There may be something He wants you to see by His apparent "withholding." Scripture tells us "No good thing does He withhold from those who walk uprightly" (Psalm 84:11b). If you are walking uprightly, and He is truly withholding, then what you are asking for might not actually be a "good thing" for you. Or it just isn't time. Thank Him, again, for what He can see that you cannot.
- 5. He will allow or withhold whatever will keep you right where you need to be when it comes to your relationship with Him. In Matthew 7:11, Jesus said, "If you, then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask him!" Your holiness is more important to God than your happiness. And He knows what is making you or keeping you holy and dependent on Him. Thank Him that He desires your eternal joy over your temporal joy and He won't let you have anything that isn't eternally good for you.
- 6. He will do whatever it takes (in blessing or withholding blessing) in order to keep you clinging to Him. God knows if we have everything we want and need, we will tend to think we don't truly need Him. And we won't cling to Him. So He will sometimes allow us to have or not have whatever will keep us clinging to Him. Thank Him that He is a God who wants you clinging, rather than a God who couldn't care less about you. v
- God desires your completion in Him and sometimes He can do more work in you, while you are waiting, than
 if He immediately granted your request. Thank Him that He is not satisfied until you are complete in Christ
 Jesus. He is the Only One who can do that work in us. Thank Him that He will complete the work He has
 started in you (Philippians 1:6).

There now, after thanking Him for those 7 things, aren't you starting to love Him even more than what it is you're asking for? I hope so. Because I truly believe that's the point. ❖

Missionary of the Week

Huynh Tung Gospelink - Vietnam

Greetings to you in the love of Jesus, our Redeemer!

Thank you so much for loving us and supporting our ministry! We are thrilled that you have partnered in supporting our mission continued. We are honored to have you as our partners, and we hope that more people will be saved from our efforts in the upcoming years.

My family and I are so blessed to serve the Lord among the K'ho tribe. My wife is our home bank. She watches over our children and manages home. Since the worldly economic has decreased everywhere, our oldest daughter lost her job because her factory received a few and small orders. She decided to return home land. She just starts her business at home town by opening the milk tea shop. It starts good. The next daughter is excited to enter her freshman. Our smallest son, Khai, is on his summer break. He still has two more years of high school.



Mr. and Mrs. Ka Di came to know Jesus.

We are living in a natural living environment. Most villagers are believers so we behave each other like in a family. We have received some coconuts, jacket fruit, and banana in this summer. We also have some extra to give to our neighbors. It is good for us to raise chickens. They have provided many fresh eggs. By late June, we have over 60 baby chicks for sale.

Ministry & Training

At the beginning of this quarter, it was great to learn one of a series found in Luke chapter 11 - To listen to and do the Lord's Word. Do it from the heart for the Lord and not for people. We will receive an inheritance as a reward. All believers need to practice God's Word. From these spiritual lessons, a sister, name Lien expressed her experience: to practically apply is to include the scripture into your prayers. She has prayed, and would continue to pray for the same thing in her daily devotion.

Our church had two little faith brothers: K' John and K' Garn who were often drunk on alcohol. They said that the Scripture did not concern about drinking alcohol forbidden. We met them and reminded them of the words of Paul in I Cor. 10: 23: "I have the right to do anything," you say, but not everything is beneficial. "I have the right to do anything," but not everything is constructive. We asked them to read and meditate on this verse, prayed, and came closer to them. We have encouraged them to return to worship the Lord. Thank God, in recent weeks both of them have come to church. Their hearts have been changed and they stopped drinking alcohol. They realize the important of their bodies which God has abided in.

In November 2022, one of our dear Sisters in Church, named Ka Yeu, who was very sick. She was taken to the hospital. After checking her health, he doctor used oxygen to support her breath and he thought that her life might extent for 2 weeks, thinking she was going to die. I prepared a lecture for her funeral. But, thank God - through the prayers of the Church members, the Lord raised her up from her bed. She now attends Church service every week. She gives her thanks to God for allowing her life continued.

On 15-17 June 2023, we hosted the VBS for almost 100 children. They all were excited to gather in Church and learn about God: His love, forgiveness, gentle, kindness, mercy, provision.

On 22-24 June 2023, 14 teenagers went to Song Dinh Church to attend the Teenager Camp. They experienced time with God privately.

Outreach

Once, I testified for Mr. K' Dieu who was living nearby my place. He had previously committed murder. Then he returned from prison to work and live with his family. I met him and shared with him about God's salvation. He said that his sins could not be forgiven by God. Although, I show him to read verses in 1 John 1:9; Psalm 103:12; and Isaiah 1:18, explained the meaning to him, but he still wouldn't confess. His hardened heart prevented him from coming to know God as his Savior. Currently, I and the deacons are praying for him that we will see him again someday to witness Jesus for him.

There are 10 catholic followers, living in our village. In this quarter, we started to reach them, pray for their salvation in Christ's name. Thank you Jesus that on Sunday May 7 2023, Mr. and Mrs. K'Di have returned to God. Another family that have the husband and children who attended our Church service on May 14. They loved hearing God's word. I have taught the sound doctrine to these 3 people. Hope they will learn more about God's commandments then practice in their daily lives. They are thirsty for His Words because the Catholic church priests did not teach Scripture to congregation.

Two people believed in God in this quarter, one of them is Mrs. Ka Thi Luyen, wanted to return to serve with Brothers in Church. However, her parents, catholic followers, firmly refused her wish. They said that if she followed the Protestant religion and believed in Jesus, they would abandon her. So she did not dare to public her faith in Jesus. We keep her in our daily prayer.
