### From Pastor David

### **Worship Plus Two**

"The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control." -Galatians 5:22-23

August is harvest month from our gardens: beans, cucumbers, zucchini, tomatoes. So good, and so good for you! I just saw the first of the sweet corn, too! The fruits and vegetables fresh from the garden taste so much better than what you get trucked in at a store.

This has made me think that God feels the same way...about us! Each of us are plants growing in God's garden. But as plants, we have a purpose. It's not just to grow big and beautiful, although that is important. God does want us to grow up into healthy, sturdy, and mature people of faith. But the point is not for us to just have a great personal relationship with God. God also intends for us to bear fruit. God wants us as His plants in His garden to produce fruit!

Last summer, about this time, Evangel's Church Council was reading John 15, where Jesus teaches about the vine and branches. We are the branches and Jesus is the Vine. We are called to stay connected to the Vine. The purpose? In verse 5, Jesus says, "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit."

In a sharing time this past week, one of the elders of our church commented, "Fruit never serves the plant that produces it; it is always for the benefit of others." Wow! What a re-visioning of the purpose of our discipleship! The fruit God seeks is the ways we share His blessings with others: the way we use our lives to bless God's other children. The Bible talks about it in terms of spiritual fruit, or fruit of the [Holy] Spirit. God is excited about the harvest of our fruit so that the blessing is shared.

We are each branches in the God's garden! We are called to grow spiritually. For us, that means each of us as individual plants growing closer to God personally. That also means each of us growing closer with one another in God's family so we can be the diverse and full garden God intends. But it also means that we all grow into our calling to bear fruit of blessing: touching others for God.

So, as we are watering, weeding, pruning and tending our gardens, all for the purpose of harvesting delicious fruit, let us also be intentional about tending our spiritual lives so that we can bear the delicious fruit God is anticipating. One way to cultivate our lives for producing good spiritual fruit is to commit to the "Worship Plus Two" pattern. We grow well as Christians with a "W+2" cadence. That means each week or two, engage in three acts.

Worship. Attend corporate worship, and in person when you can. There is no substitute for this. We engage God not as individuals, but as a community. If we are in town, let's commit to being in worship!

"Plus two." This means doing two additional activities. One is to do something that intentionally helps you grow personally closer to God ("one for you"). Engage in personal devotions. Go to a Christian concert. Attend an online conference. Participate in a small group (new small groups coming in September!).

The other is to do something that intentionally helps someone else ("one for someone else"). Serve in some way. There are tons of opportunities available through our church. You can also do this on your own: volunteer an afternoon somewhere, mentor a student, go pick up trash along the road.

Worship Plus Two. One for God, one for you, one for someone else. Love God. Love Others. Serve as Christ's Hands and Feet. That's our church's motto! It's also the cadence that leads to spiritual growth.

Next time you get excited about fresh garden produce, think about how God gets excited about the fruit of His people. Let's commit to "W+2," and producing good fruit!

### Evangel's Culture of Hospitality: All Are Welcome!

### Evangel extends a warm welcome to all who desire to connect and engage!

It's up to YOU! Everyone who is a part of Evangel is called to embody and extend that welcome, especially when at the Evangel building and particularly on Sunday mornings. Sunday mornings we make a special effort to make sure everyone feels welcome:

- Attend in person so you can meet other people.
- Plan to come early and stay after worship in order to mingle and connect with others.
- Please wear a name tag Sunday mornings (available at the Welcome Center).
- Sit by someone in the sanctuary you don't know well (Yes, change where you sit!).
- Make a point to spend three minutes after worship to introduce yourself to those around you in the sanctuary.
- Make a point to spend ten minutes after worship connecting with people you don't know as well.
- Everyone is asked to mingle in the lobby before and after worship, making a point to engage people who are not visiting with others. If someone is alone, that's YOUR cue to go and introduce yourself.



- Before leaving someone in the lobby, introduce them to someone else nearby.
- Offer guidance to people unfamiliar with Evangel: point out the bathrooms, the all-needs bathrooms, the drinking fountain, the nursery, the Welcome Center, the classrooms.

### Other ideas to extend hospitality:

- Sit by someone you don't know well in Sunday School, at the Wednesday Community Dinner, and other times.
- Reach out to folks you haven't seen in a while.
- Write a "get well" or "praying for you" card to people listed on the prayer list.
- Invite someone new to go with you to a small group or event.
- Invite someone else to serve with you at an event or function.


### An Exciting Line Up of Activities for the 2025-2026 Intergenerational Club

### **Support a Child's Education**

### The Ormsby School, Baiwalla, Sierra Leone | 2025–2026 School Year

Baiwalla is a rural town in Sierra Leone where 40% of adults are illiterate and many families live on \$2/day. The Ormsby School—built with church and individual support—equips students with the tools to break the cycle of poverty.

### Your Help Is Needed!

The Rev. Rick Ormsby School in Biawalla, Sierra Leone, serves 500 students in grades 1–12 and is the only secondary school within a 50-mile radius. Rising costs for supplies, teacher salaries, and student meals are putting significant pressure on the school's budget. Your support is vital to keeping education accessible for these students and ensuring that teachers remain motivated and well-equipped to teach.
