From Pastor David

"The grace of our Lord was poured out on me abundantly, along with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus". -1 Timothy 1:14

The best way to share your faith with others is simply to be ready and willing to tell about how God has helped you in your life.

Think of how you easily recommend a good restaurant you've found, how you quickly encourage even a stranger in the grocery line to try your favorite app, or how you enjoy passing along a hack you've discovered for cleaning the grill. It's a joy to pass along ideas and solutions to others, especially if it could really help them out.

Sharing about our faith in Jesus can seem a lot harder. People may not appreciate hearing about religion or our spiritual beliefs. You don't want to be seen as "that kind of person."

But faith sharing is not really talking religion, or even talking about what we believe. There are times and opportunities that we can explain what Christians believe and why. But that's not what faith sharing is.

It's sharing from what we have experienced. This is the key difference. It's not sharing beliefs (information), it's sharing experience (inspiration). You have experienced God's presence and help. Jesus has made a difference in your life. You have found the Holy Spirit guiding you, giving you inner peace and bringing about a change.

So, the first step in faith sharing is to reflect on your experiences of God in your life. How have you experienced God's help? How has God seen you through difficulties that you could not have gotten through on your own? What joys and blessings has God given you? Think about specific instances, examples, stories.

The next step is to wait for natural, easy "open doors" in your regular conversations. In your normal interactions with others, they will share details from their own lives that will be an "open door" for you to share about how God has been important to you.

It's like when someone shares that they are going to go out for dinner this Friday. This is when you would naturally pitch your new restaurant recommendation: "Oh, have you tried The Green Grill? It's my new favorite! You'd love it!" Or when your coworker says he's going to fire up the grill for the family gathering this weekend. That's when you say, "Hey, I've learned that when you turn your grill on to 500 degrees for 15 minutes, it cleans the grill and makes it super easy to simply wipe down with a cloth ready for use."

Same with faith sharing. When a coworker shares about problems with the kids, that's when you can share about how Jesus helped you become a better parent. When a neighbor confides in you that they're having relationship struggles, you can encourage them by how the Holy Spirit helped change you to save your relationship. When a friend discloses her struggle with money and spending, you can respond by how God's principles for money are helping you get out of debt. Then, before you finish, ask if it would be okay if you prayed for them. And, with the boldness from the Holy Spirit, you can even offer to pray WITH them, right then and there.

That's what faith sharing is! It is sharing how Jesus has-and continues-to make a difference in vour life.

I also want to ask you to consider sharing a God moment from your life with the rest of us. Perhaps you could record a 3-5 minute story of how God has really helped you in an impactful way. You can record yourself on your own device, or come into the church and have Tim record you sometime. A couple of tips are to include an object or picture if you can, a Bible verse, and a brief, closing prayer. Again, overall length need not be more than 3-5 minutes. Simply email it to the church office. We want to include faith sharing videos in worship each week this summer. You can be a part of that!

Reflect on how being a Christian has had an impact on your life. Then ask the Holy Spirit what story you could share. After all, we each has experienced the richness of the grace of our Lord...poured out on us abundantly. Share about it!

Financial Summary

On behalf of the Finance Committee, here is a financial summary of the operations of the church through April 2023. The financial contributions of the church have been great so far in 2023 and we are thankful for those that have met their financial estimate of giving.

January — April 2023

Income from Church Congregation Giving	\$ 191,906
Other Operating Income	\$ 24,799
Total Income from Operations	\$ 216,705
Total Expense from Operations	\$ 228,433
Net Income / (Loss) from Operations	\$ (11,729)

As you can see, we are currently operating at a \$11,729 loss for the year. A reason for the loss has been some unexpected expenses early in the year. Another reason is the anticipated shortfall of income in 2023. Please know we as the Finance Committee will continue to monitor the cost of operating the church and provide reports through the newsletter in 2023. Thank you Evangel family for your incredible generosity! You have met a real need in our city for a foundational life resource for hundreds of hurting people.




End of the Year Youth Party was on May 19!

That's a wrap folks...

At our campfire, I asked people to share about their experiences over the past year. It was heart warming to hear from both the youth and the adult leaders. I truly believe that the adult leaders got as much (if not more) from this youth program than the kids did. Some of the things the adults mentioned were:

- Watching the kids dive not the Word.
- Asking tough and insightful questions.
- Bringing their heart for worship and learning new music.
- The inability to stay quiet while playing the game sardines.
- Watching them grow together as a group.
- Finding creative ways to be present in our congregation.
- Hearing kids step out in courage and offering prayers for the group.
- The invitation to friends. Our kids do a better job of inviting people to church than the adults do.
- On any given Friday night, 50% of the kids in attendance are not Evangel Kids.

But things don't stop there. There are several things to watch for over the summer:

- Pop up youth events. We have been contacted by several local Methodist churches to help create a regional youth event for smaller churches to have something for their kids to participate in.
- Mission trip in July
- Commissioning service July 23
- Youth Mission Service in August
- MEGA Kids Camp in July

- Youth Kick of Rally (grades 6-12) September 15, 7-9 PM
- We will be meeting again on Friday night.
- Mission trip dates should be available in early fall.


