

From the Pastor's Perspective

*"For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus."
- 1 Timothy 2:5*

We've been asking "Who Is Jesus?" every week since before Christmas. To answer our question, we've gone to the Bible again and again and have seen that Jesus is the Promised Messiah/ Savior, God with us, God's Son, Fully Human, Fully Divine, Rabbi, Healer, Preacher, Miracle Worker and so much more.

But what about outside the Bible? What early references are there to Jesus?

This year is a special year. It marks the 2000th anniversary of Jesus beginning His public ministry. Luke records in 3:23 that "Jesus was Himself about 30 years old when He began His ministry...." We also know from historical records that King Herod, who was the Jewish king when Jesus was born, died in 4 B.C. Further, since the Bible records that Herod died shortly after Jesus' birth (Matt. 2:19), most scholars estimate that Jesus was born in 4 B.C. or shortly before.

Note also that there is no "Year 0" in our historical calendars. The year 1 B.C. is followed directly by A.D. 1. So, if Jesus was born in 4 B.C., and He began preaching and teaching at the age of 30, that would mean that Jesus "came onto the scene" in the year A.D. 26. So, this year, then, is the 2000th anniversary of Jesus beginning His public ministry! What an exciting milestone and anniversary! Over the next three-and-a-half years (the length of Jesus' earthly ministry), we will mark the 2000th anniversary of all that Jesus did while walking among people.

To mark this exciting anniversary, Reese and I are planning on leading a Christian History Study Tour of Jesus' earthly life to the Holy Land next year, in 2027. Make plans to travel with us, but more importantly, pray for stability in the Middle East so we will be able to travel safely.

So our plan to "walk where Jesus walked" takes us back to our question of "Who Is Jesus?" and what sources outside the Bible say about Jesus. Is there any evidence that Jesus was an actual historical figure who really did live (and walk the earth) in ancient Israel?

Actually, there is quite a strong extra-biblical record of Jesus as a real person. Perhaps the most referenced is Flavius Josephus, a Jewish historian of the 1st century A.D. writing for the Romans. In his *Antiquities of the Jews* (c. AD 93-94) Josephus mentions Jesus twice, describing Jesus as a wise man who was crucified under Pontius Pilate, the Roman Prefect confirmed archaeologically to govern the Roman province of Judaea from A.D. 26/27 to 36/37.

Secondly, Tacitus, a Roman historian, records in about A.D. 116 that "Christus" had been executed during the reign of Emperor Tiberius by Pontius Pilate. It is interesting to note that by that time, Jesus had become known as "The Christ" even by the Romans.

About the same time, Pliny "the Younger," the governor of Bithynia (northern Turkey), writes to Emperor Trajan in about A.D. 112 describing Christians worshiping Christ "as a god." By the end of the 2nd century, historical references to Jesus proliferated exponentially!

So, on this 2000th anniversary of Jesus emerging as a public figure who traveled around preaching, teaching, healing and calling disciples, we can answer the question "Who Is Jesus?" using extra-biblical sources and say for certain that Jesus was a real historical man who lived in Roman Galilee and who was crucified in Roman Judea under Pontius Pilate. As Paul says in 1 Timothy 2:5, we must all agree that He was "the man Christ Jesus."

The question, however, if Jesus is also fully God, is God's only Son and the only Savior of the world, well, that is a question we must each answer for ourselves. In fact, that is the most important question we must answer. It is an answer that makes all the difference!

As we continue through Lent, we will keep asking the question, "Who Is Jesus?" Keep your eyes fixed on this man Jesus as you journey to Jerusalem together with Him and see if He just might be the One who can change your life. Jesus is more than you can imagine, and that makes all the difference!

Evangel Really Does Care - and It Shows!

The recent appeal for support in response to those in fear and facing disruption in our community has been nothing short of miraculous! Evangel made this appeal for those with whom we have a partnership:

- The Good News Children's Center housed at Evangel (serving many minority children).
- Zumbro Ridge Estates (with its majority Hispanic population).
- The Hispanic Pentecostal Church (who meets at Evangel's building).

Boxes and boxes of diapers and wipes as well as dry goods were collected, valued in the hundreds of dollars! On top of that, we received \$7,495 in donations as well!

As the need is timely and urgent, our church has quickly distributed these donations:

- Diapers and wipes to 9 children of Good News Children's Center families.
- Diapers (including \$200) to Zumbro Ridge Estates.
- Dry food goods (two deliveries) to Zumbro Ridge Estates Food Shelf.
- \$1,200 to Zumbro Ridge Estates to stock their freezer with perishables (meat).
- \$1,200 to Zumbro Ridge Estates to resupply their freezer with perishables (meat) when depleted.
- \$2,550 to cover the cost for the Hispanic Church to continue to meet at Evangel for three months.
- \$2,400 to purchase food and needed supplies for families of the Hispanic Church.

Future donations will be applied to restocking the Zumbro Ridge Estates Food Shelf, as that serves a continuing need.

Thank you, Evangel family, for your generous and compassionate response! God has worked through us to make a "hands and feet of Jesus" difference in Rochester once again! We are a church "for" Rochester, and we have shared God's love and hope in tangible ways.

- "Practice hospitality." – Romans 12:13b



Bob Koebke joined Evangel’s distinguished “Over 90s Club” on Dec. 9, 2025. Bob has been a part of Evangel since 1969, when he and Jean moved in across the street to the West. Both Bob and Jean grew up in Rochester, and they met when Jean was still in high school. Her friend group and his friend group had agreed to go to a ball game together. Then, when all of her friends had to back out, and all of his friends had to back out also, Bob decided to take Jean to a movie: their first date! They have now been married 67 years, have three daughters, nine grand children and 11 great-grandchildren. Bob first worked for his father, a contractor, before working for a local cabinet and countertop company for his career. He finally retired (the second time!) at the age of 82. Even so, Bob continues in the wood shop working odd jobs and whatever is needed. He continues making wooden bowls and other hand-made items. He also mows the grass and plows the snow at Real Life Co-Op, where they have lived the last 20 years.

Bob used to be an avid bowler, and he is in the Rochester’s Bowling Hall of Fame! He continues to golf, play pool, enjoy sports and reads a lot. He is again reading through the Bible on his own. One Bible story he remembers is when King David was grieving the death of his son. David said, “I cannot bring him back, but some day I will go to him.” Bob thinks about how some day he will see all his family and loved ones when he will go to them.

When asked what advice to live by he would offer to others, Bob suggests, “love and respect others, especially your mate!” When you disagree, remember that you are also partly in the wrong. Bob says that he and Jean are going to try for another 67 years!

Come for the whole morning! There will be plenty of fun activities between egg hunts.




